- ---specified a portion of Pastor Crowell's salary to be designated as Housing Allowance in 2015;
- ---authorized the Executive Committee and staff to appoint committee members and lay assistants for 2015:

#### TRINITY LUTHERAN FOUNDATION GRANTS

The Trinity Lutheran Church Foundation Committee met in December to consider grant applications for 2014. Nine grants totaling \$60,000 were awarded to the following recipients:

- •AID Upstate \$4,462 to help fund a project to offer HIV/AIDS testing and prevention counseling for the Hispanic population in Anderson and Greenville counties.
- •Greenville Area Interfaith Hospitality Network (GAIHN) \$10,600 to facilitate quality transitional housing and case management for homeless families.
- •Lutheran Campus Ministry at Clemson \$2,000 to help the Lutheran Campus Ministry Network construct four Habitat for Humanity Houses at the 2015 ELCA Youth Gathering in Detroit.
- •Lutheran Homes of South Carolina Foundation \$10,000 to subsidize the care of retired pastors, church workers, and their spouses who live in the five Lutheran Homes of South Carolina retirement communities.
- •NAMI of Greenville \$2,146 to help fund an outreach and education program called Family-to -Family.
- •Trinity Lutheran Church \$2,000 to provide scholarship assistance to Sarah Delap for two classes at the seminary.
- •Trinity Lutheran Church \$4,000 to provide financial assistance to Drew Culp for his year in ministry in Argentina with the ELCA Young Adults in Global Mission.
- •Trinity Lutheran Church \$22,686 to provide financial assistance to Trinity's Youth and their leaders to attend the National Youth Gathering in Detroit in the summer of 2015.
- •Trinity Lutheran Church \$2,106 to provide financial assistance for an Adult Mission Trip to Maryland led by Vicar Rusty Kehl.

## **CONGREGATION BEACH RETREAT**



#### **ADULT MISSION TRIP**

Greetings and Peace, Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

Luke shares with us in Acts 20:35, "In everything I showed you that by working hard in this manner you must help the weak and remember the words of the Lord Jesus, that he himself said, "It is more blessed to give than receive."

In the spring of 2015, as a part of fulfilling my internship here at Trinity Lutheran, I will be leading a mission trip to Crisfield, Maryland. This town still suffers from the effects of hurricane Sandy. The group will be working to restore people's homes and in a sense helping to return their life to some degree of normalcy. Situated at the end of a road and on the waters of Chesapeake Bay, Crisfield was deemed the "Forgotten Town." It is my desire to reinforce to the people of Crisfield, with your help, that God has not forgotten them. Crisfield, once known as the "Seafood Capital of the World," is the poorest town in Somerset County, which is the poorest county in Maryland. It is our plan to travel, using personal vehicles, to Crisfield on Sunday, May 10 and return on May 16. A facility is provided in Crisfield that will house us during our stay and can hold up to 25 people. It is also in our preliminary plans to take one day. Friday May 15, as a free day and go on an adventure. The cost of the trip is \$150.00 per person and covers all expenses other than meals up and back, and any other monies spent for personal use.
