At the November meeting of the Congregation Council, the council

- ---participated in a SC Synod presentation entitled Where is the Spirit Leading?;

- ---agreed by consensus that the December Congregation Council meeting will be held on Sunday, December 13 at 3:30 pm.


2016 ENVELOPES
