Dear Members of the Trinity family,
God satisfies the thirsty, and fills the hungry with good things.
Psalm 107:9

As a family of faith we will enter the Lenten season on Ash Wednesday, February 10 with opportunities to worship at 12:30 pm and at 6:15 pm. Both services will include the Imposition of Ashes as well as Holy Communion. On the following Wednesdays during our Lenten journey we will explore the theme of our universal hunger for God. All of us experience emptiness in our lives. We attempt to fill the void with food, alcohol, drugs, possessions, money, sex, and power. We soon discover that none of these things has lasting power to satisfy the emptiness we experience.

Over the years many theologians have described this void in our lives as a God-shaped hole - a place in our hearts that only God can fill. We can try to fill this God-shaped hole with other things but ultimately nothing satisfies and we are left feeling empty, lost, and alone. This Lenten season provides an opportunity for us to recognize the broken, empty places in our lives and begin to find healing and wholeness through God. God promises to fill our emptiness, ease our suffering, satisfy our thirst, and fill us with good things. All of us share a common hunger for love, acceptance, healing, and forgiveness, and God is eager to satisfy our hunger with God's love.

Sunday after Sunday as we approach the altar on bended knees to receive the body and blood of our Lord, we do so with open, empty hands. Our need, our emptiness, our dependence, our vulnerability, and our deep hunger for God is clearly evident in this act. I encourage you to commit to this Lenten season. Join your brothers and sisters in Christ for worship each Wednesday. Come and experience God's grace and healing. Come and allow God to fill your deepest hunger.

At the January meeting of the Congregation Council, the council

---learned from the Treasurer that the 2015 budget of \$1,207,467 was fully funded and that the Net Working Fund on January 1, 2016 included an increase of \$24,511 from the previous year;
---learned that Pastor Setzler will continue to serve periodically as Stated Supply leading worship on Sunday morning;
---heard a brief update on the progress toward an agreement with a Parking Management Company to manage Trinity's parking;
---received a brief update on plans for a columbarium at Trinity; and
---agreed by consensus that the next meeting of Congregation Council will take place on Sunday, February 7 at 1:30 pm.

There will be a two part series for girls and women focusing on body image and women's empowerment held on Sunday, March 13 from 3:00-5:00 pm and Sunday, April 10 from 3:00-5:00 pm. The hope for this series of events is to empower girls and women of all ages to accept and embrace their identity as beloved children of God, in addition to educating both men and women on the topic of domestic abuse with a focus on where the church is called to action. 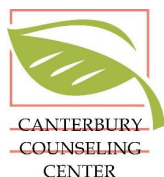
GREENVILLE AREA INTERFAITH HOSPITALITY NETWORK

PRAYER GROUP

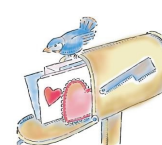

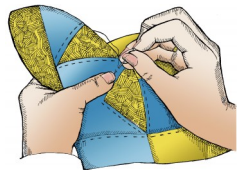
