Education

Sunday School - **Today**, **10:10** am. Sunday School is offered for all ages every Sunday between the 9:00 and 11:15 am services. Preschoolers (infants through children under the age of four) may attend the *First Faith* class with their parents. A nursery is also available. Children's Sunday School for those who were four or five on September 1 meets on the first floor of the Education Building, across from the elevator. Children in grades 1 through 5 meet in *Grace Place*, upstairs in the Education Building. Youth Sunday School for middle and high school students meets in the Youth Center. Meeting as separate groups, youth will enjoy "pick up" breakfast items, games, fellowship and devotions in a new format for this school year.

Adult Sunday School always begins with Coffee and Conversation in the Multipurpose Room beginning at 9:50 am. There are currently four adult classes begin offered. The class *Right Click: Parenting Your Teen in a Digital Media World* is a class recommended for parents of children of any age. This class is exploring and discussing issues related to digital media including cell phone usage, gaming and social media, as well as setting limits, bullying and responsibility. A second class is called *Wearing God*. Based on the book by Lauren F. Winner, this class delves into overlooked ways of meeting God. The third class is *Reformation Through the Lens of Scripture*. This class is studying texts and hymns related to the Reformation and Martin Luther. The final class is entitled *What Does It Mean to be a Lutheran?* This six week class is designed for those who are exploring the possibility of joining Trinity, and examines the Christian faith from a Lutheran perspective.
