Dear Members of the Trinity Family,

As the summer approaches, I am attempting to reclaim the practice of keeping Sabbath, setting aside times and spaces to be still and quiet in the presence of God, times and spaces to stop working, to stop accomplishing and to simply rest. In the relentless busyness of modern life, we have lost the essential rhythm of work and rest. We are so busy running from one appointment, obligation, deadline, and activity to the next that we barely have a moment to breathe. We are in desperate need of rest. We are in desperate need of times and spaces to heal, grow, relax, disconnect, recover, and reclaim our sacred identity as God's beloved, precious baptized children.

Our culture teaches us that doing something - anything - is better than doing nothing. Sabbath is not a day off to catch up on television and errands. Sabbath is a time to stop, to surrender, to cease moving, doing, and achieving. Sabbath requires us to stop, not because we have gotten everything done, all our tasks accomplished, all the emails answered and calls returned. Sabbath requires us to stop because it is time to stop, time to rest, time to be at peace. Sabbath is lighting candles, gathering for worship and prayer, keeping silence, reading, walking, breathing, and sharing a meal with people we love and care about.

Practicing sabbath does not come easy to me. In fact, it is a struggle for me, but I recognize the need for quiet that imparts wisdom, the need for rest that imparts understanding. I invite you to join me this summer in the ancient practice of sabbath-keeping. May these times of stillness and silence bring you peace and joy, meaning and contentment, and a closer relationship to God and the community of Christ at Trinity.


