Columbarium. The columbarium will be located in the space in the courtyard behind the altar in the church. To learn more about this project and how you can reserve a niche, the Columbarium Committee invites you to attend an information session that will be held in the Parlor on Wednesday, March 20 at 1:15 pm (after Lenten mid-day worship). It would be most helpful if you could communicate to the Church Office if you plan to attend this gathering.

In order for a columbarium on Trinity's campus to become a reality, a number of niches must be reserved before a contract can be signed. Each double niche will cost \$4,400. Niches reserved between March 4 and May 31 will be available for a reduced cost of \$4,000. In the unlikely event that enough niches are not reserved to support the Columbarium project, all monies will be returned. A packet of information has been mailed, and information may also be found on Trinity's website.

Good Samaritan Ministry.
