

## Education

**Sunday School - Today.** Sunday School is offered for all ages every Sunday between the 9:00 and 11:15 am services. Preschoolers aged under the age of four are invited to *First Faith* with their parents for fellowship and Bible stories. This class meets across the hall from the Nursery. A nursery is also available. Children's Sunday School for those who were four or five on September 1 meets on the first floor of the Education Building, across from the elevator. Children in grades 1 through 5 meet in *Grace Place*, upstairs in the Education Building. Youth Sunday School for middle and high school students meets in the Youth Center to enjoy food, learning and service projects.

It also inspires all people, and perhaps especially Christians, to work toward diversity, inclusion, acceptance, and forgiveness in our homes and hearts, as well as in our communities and across the globe. This book is an eye-opening call to action to work for racial justice.
