A reading from First Peter.

²Like newborn infants, long for the pure, spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow into salvation—³if indeed you have tasted that the Lord is good.

⁴Come to Christ, a living stone, though rejected by mortals yet chosen and precious in God's sight, and ⁵like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. ⁶For it stands in scripture:

"See, I am laying in Zion a stone, a cornerstone chosen and precious;

and whoever believes will not be put to shame."

⁷To you then who believe, Christ is precious; but for those who do not believe,

"The stone that the builders rejected has become the very head of the corner," $^{\rm 8}\!and$

"A stone that makes them stumble, and a rock that makes them fall."

They stumble because they disobey the word, as they were destined to do.

⁹But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, in order that you may proclaim the mighty acts of the one who called you out of darkness into the marvelous light.

The words that I say to you I do not speak on my own; but God who dwells in me does God's works. ¹¹Believe me that I am in God and God is in me; but if you do not, then believe me because of the works themselves. ¹²Very truly, I tell you, the one who believes in me will also do the works that I do and, in fact, will do greater works than these, because I am going to God. ¹³I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that God may be glorified in me. ¹⁴If in my name you ask me for anything, I will do it."
