Dear Members of the Trinity Family,

As a girl of fourteen coming of age in small town, rural South Carolina, I often had the feeling that I did not belong. Most of my friends could not imagine a life beyond that familiar, restrictive place. They could not imagine that meaningful life could be found beyond that small town. But, I always wanted more, always thought that there would be a place where I would feel more at home, a place where I would truly belong. No one could understand why I did not choose to marry a local boy, buy a trailer, and live within yards of my parents. To many of my friends I seemed odd, peculiar, strange.

Belonging is being accepted for who you are. Fitting in is changing who you are in order to be accepted. In high school, I did a lot of the latter. It was not until I went away to Furman that I found a place of belonging, a place where I was free to truly be myself, a place where I could be loved and valued for exactly who I was. I knew after that first semester away at college that I would never be able to go home to live. A whole new world had opened up for me and I could not give up the heady feeling of belonging.

That is what we all want in life. We want to belong. We want to be loved, honored, valued, and accepted for who we are. We do not want to pretend, to be untrue to ourselves, to be forced to be someone we are not. We desire to be fully known and in the knowing to be fully loved and accepted. That is our hope for our life together at Trinity. We are striving to build and nurture a community of faith where everyone is free to be their truest, most authentic selves: a place where all belong, where all have value and worth. In our life together at Trinity, you can be you. You can be who God made you to be. You can belong. This community needs you and loves you. Bask in the simple knowledge that at Trinity, that in God's kingdom, you belong.
