Dear Members of the Trinity Family,

During the opening devotions of the January meeting of Trinity's Congregation Council, I invited each person to select a word that could be a prayer intention or focus for the coming year. My word was trust, specifically trust in God. When I selected the intention, my hope was that throughout the year God would strengthen and increase my ability to trust. Of course, at the time, no one had any idea how many opportunities I would have in the first six months of 2020 to trust God. I wish that I could write to you that my trust has increased, that I always have faith in God's provision, but that is simply not true. I still struggle to trust that God will provide for me, my family, and our Trinity family in these uncertain, unprecedented times.

I lie awake at night worrying that there will not be enough...not enough time, not enough energy, not enough money, not enough wisdom, not enough grace, not enough help and support. I worry about the decisions that must be made, the difficult work that must be done, the relentless pace of ministry in this time. I worry about doing ministry in ways that are new, different, and strange. I worry about providing for my family. I worry about acquiring the skills and abilities that will enable Trinity to move into an unknown future. My faith in God often wavers.

The passage from 2 Corinthians 5:7 is a comfort to me. I keep moving forward, keep taking the next step, not because I can see what the future holds or because I know the right thing to do. What I do know is that we cannot be still, that we cannot be content with current realities. We must continue to step forward in faith. We must take risks. We must be brave and bold. We must trust that God is with us - guiding us. sustaining us, and strengthening us. I am learning that we do not need to see the future in order to trust in the future. I am learning that we do not need to know when the world will be safe again in order to trust that the day will come. May we have faith, in both our individual lives and in our corporate life, to trust God.

TRINITY STAFF RESTRUCTURING

After reviewing all staff positions in light of recent changes precipitated by the Covid19 crisis, the Executive Committee determined that adjustments needed to be made in four positions to better reflect actual time required to meet current ministry needs and to be faithful stewards of the congregation's resources. 
