



Operation InAsMuch

Since 2009, Trinity has taken part in Operation InAsMuch, a day of mission work for our community. COVID cancelled our plans for a spring event, so we are excited to offer a physically distanced, masked fall event for the congregation. Join us on Saturday morning, November 7 in the Activities Building to meet some needs in the community.

There will be two in person events at the church that morning, beginning at 9 am. Each event is limited to 10 persons, and is by reservation only, through the Church Office.

<u>Homeless Period Project</u>: *The Homeless Period Project* serves girls and women in South Carolina and across the nation. Ten volunteers will work at Trinity to package feminine care products for distribution.

Fleece Blankets: UpstateFoodNotBombs is a local organization that serves the homeless community in Greenville. They have a weekly food distribution, which also includes clothing, medical supplies, hygiene items and other things that help our homeless neighbors survive. As winter approaches, there is a great need for blankets. Ten volunteers will work at Trinity to cut and tie fleece blankets. No sewing is involved. Fleece donations are needed for this project. Fleece should be cut to 58/59 or 60 by 80.

<u>Gifts of Hope</u> is a program of the wider church, which allows individuals to provide daily needs, build for the future or bring joy to persons or organizations in need.
