#### FIRST READING

#### Ezekiel 34:11-16, 20-24

A reading from Ezekiel.

<sup>11</sup>Thus says the Lord GOD: I myself will search for my sheep, and will seek them out. <sup>12</sup>As shepherds seek out their flocks when they are among their scattered sheep, so I will seek out my sheep. I will rescue them from all the places to which they have been scattered on a day of clouds and thick darkness. <sup>13</sup>I will bring them out from the peoples and gather them from the countries, and will bring them into their own land; and I will feed them on the mountains of Israel, by the watercourses, and in all the inhabited parts of the land. <sup>14</sup>I will feed them with good pasture, and the mountain heights of Israel shall be their pasture; there they shall lie down in good grazing land, and they shall feed on rich pasture on the mountains of Israel. <sup>15</sup>I myself will be the shepherd of my sheep, and I will make them lie down, says the Lord GOD. <sup>16</sup>I will seek the lost, and I will bring back the strayed, and I will bind up the injured, and I will strengthen the weak, but the fat and the strong I will destroy. I will feed them with justice.



<sup>15</sup>From the time I first heard of your faith in Christ Jesus and your love for all of the holy ones,<sup>16</sup>I have never stopped thanking God for you and remembering you in my prayers.<sup>17</sup>I pray that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the God of glory, will give you a spirit of wisdom and of revelation to bring you to a rich knowledge of the Creator. <sup>18</sup>I pray that God will enlighten the eyes of your mind that you can see the hope this call holds for you – the promised glories that God's holy ones will inherit, <sup>19</sup>and the infinitely great power that is exercised for us who believe. Matthew 25:31-46

The Holy Gospel according to Saint Matthew, the twenty fifth chapter. Glory to you, O Lord.

<sup>31</sup>"At the appointed time the Promised One will come in glory, escorted by all the angels of heaven, and will sit upon the royal throne, <sup>32</sup>with all the nations assembled below. Then the Promised One will separate them from one another, as a shepherd divides the sheep from the goats.<sup>33</sup>The sheep will be placed on the right hand, the goats on the left. <sup>34</sup>"The ruler will say to those on the right, 'Come, you blessed of my God! Inherit the kindom prepared for you from the creation of the world! <sup>35</sup>For I was hungry and you fed me; I was thirsty and you gave me drink. I was a stranger and you welcomed me; <sup>36</sup>I was naked and you clothed me. I was ill and you comforted me; in prison and you came to visit me.' <sup>37</sup>Then these just will ask, When did we see you hungry and feed you, or see you thirst and give you drink? <sup>38</sup>When did we see you as a stranger and invite you in, or clothe you in your nakedness? <sup>39</sup>When did we see you ill or in prison and come to visit you?<sup>40</sup>The ruler will answer them, The truth is, every time you did this for the least of my siblings you did it for me.' <sup>41</sup>Then the ruler will say to those on the left, 'Out of my sight, you accursed ones! Into that everlasting fire prepared for the Devil and the fallen angels! <sup>42</sup> I was hungry and you gave me no food; I was thirsty and you gave me nothing to drink, <sup>43</sup>I was a stranger and you gave me no welcome; naked and you gave me no clothing. I was ill and in prison and you did not visit me.' 44Then they in turn will ask, 'When did we see you hungry or thirsty, or homeless or naked, or ill or in prison and not take care of you?' <sup>45</sup>The answer will come, The truth is, as often as you neglected to do this to one of the least of these, you neglected to do it to me.<sup>246</sup>They will go off to eternal punishment, and the just will go off to eternal life.<sup>2</sup> This is the Gospel of the Lord.



#### LORD'S PRAYER


