Welcome to Trinity Lutheran Church

As disciples of Christ seeking peace and justice in the world, we welcome, affirm, and include all people into the fullness of God's love. We celebrate people of all races, cultures, ages, sexual orientations, gender identities, physical or mental abilities, socioeconomic statuses, appearances, family status and citizenship as equally loved and valued in the eyes of God and in this place. All are invited to join this community as we worship God, grow in faith, and strive to love and serve one another. All, without exception, are welcome in this place.

INTRODUCTION

We gather on this evening to lift up this congregation's desire to be a place of love, affirmation, welcome, and celebration for our gay, lesbian, transgender, bisexual, intersex, asexual, and queer siblings. We gather in solidarity to honor the inherent value and worth of every single human being, especially the transgender community. In honor of Transgender Awareness Week, we gather as a community to stand against the hatred and violence that is often directed toward our trans siblings.

In May of 2018, just one year after affirming the celebration of same-sex weddings in the life of this congregation, Trinity made the decision to become a Reconciling in Christ congregation, a designation that focuses on the welcome and inclusion of all people, specifically the LGBTQIA+ community which includes the full spectrum of sexuality.

Since these decisions two and three years ago, this congregation has become a kinder, gentler, more loving, more inclusive community of faith. Our life together has been strengthened and blessed by diversity. Our hearts have been opened to the plight of many who are marginalized by the powers of the world and the institution of the church. We gather in solidarity with our queer siblings with the desire to overcome prejudice and hatred, to help all human beings live fully and completely into their identity as God's beloved, precious children.

Trinity Lutheran Church, Greenville, SC stands against the hate, bigotry, homophobia, and judgment proclaimed in other Greenville pulpits as well as conservative, fundamentalist pulpits across the nation.

We stand against the brand of Christianity that judges, condemns, and wounds.

Called by God, this congregation stands as a beacon of love, light, hope, and healing to our LGBTQIA+ siblings who have been wounded by the church's judgment and condemnation.

We stand with our transgender siblings who have endured almost unbearable amounts of pain, judgement, and hatred from both the church and the world.

We strive daily to be a place of love, a place where love knows no boundaries, where all know that they are cherished and treasured.

We gather this evening to confess all the ways and times that we have not fully supported our queer and trans siblings.

We confess the jokes, the stereotypes, our fears, our misunderstandings, our lack of knowledge, our small-mindedness, our inability to love, embrace, and celebrate as God loves, embraces, and celebrates.

We gather this evening to stand in solidarity with our LGBTQIA+ siblings, to remember the beautiful and precious lives of our transgender siblings who lost their lives in acts of violence and hate.

We gather to pray for justice and righteousness for all people, for a world and a church that acknowledges the fact that every single person is created in the image of God and therefore worthy of love, honor, respect, and affirmation.

In this place, in our life together at Trinity, all, without exception, are loved, honored, affirmed, valued, welcomed, and celebrated.


