The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness will not overcome it. John 1:5

Dear Members of the Trinity Family,

In January the days begin to expand, lengthen, and stretch. There is more daylight, less darkness. The cold of winter seems less bleak when the sun is shining. We spend so much time trying to escape the darkness - the darkness of the night, the darkness of our lives, the darkness of our hearts. We are quick to turn on the lamp, the gas logs, the leftover Christmas lights, the overhead lights. We light candles, reach for a flashlight. We will go to great lengths to avoid the darkness. The darkness frightens us.

But, what if God is trying to use the darkness to teach us, to heal us, to bless us? What if, in the darkness, God is saying, "Please. Come. Closer"? What if the darkness is an invitation from God to sit, to be still, to settle and be attentive to our hearts, the world, and God's hopes and dreams for us?

The poet saint, Mary Oliver, writes, "Attentiveness is the root of all prayer." Perhaps the darkness is an opportunity to be attentive, to pay attention to the little things, the daily rituals of our lives. Perhaps the darkness is an invitation to savor that early morning cup of coffee, to gather by the fire with a book, to relish the moments of guiet and solitude. And just maybe those moments of peace and quiet become prayers - silent, reverent communication with God. How would our lives change if we stopped fearing the darkness, if we actually embraced the darkness, if we tried to learn from the darkness, to learn in the darkness?

These days of January are a time to be attentive. Thanks to the hope and promise of vaccines, we have every reason to be hopeful and expectant about the future. But before we leave the darkness of pandemic life, let us rest in the darkness, let us learn everything we can about ourselves and the world from this place of fear and darkness. Before we race headlong into the light, the life we are so eager to embrace, let us use these long hours of darkness to pray, to reflect, to meditate, to heal, to become the person God is calling us to be. In the darkness, may you come to see, to really see, and value the light of Christ shining on you and on the world.
