#### NICENE CREED

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father. ## GREAT THANKSGIVING


The Lord be with you. **And also with you.**


#### LORD'S PRAYER
