Prelude

WELCOME

HOLY BAPTISM In the name of the Father, and of the + Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

In baptism our gracious heavenly parent frees us from sin and death by joining us to the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. We are born children of a fallen humanity; by water and the Holy Spirit we are reborn children of God and made members of the church, the body of Christ. Living with Christ and in the communion of saints, we grow in faith, love, and obedience to the will of God.

We present Callum James Byrne Bialkowski for baptism.

Called by the Holy Spirit, trusting in the grace and love of God, do you desire to have this child baptized into Christ?

Response: We do.

As you bring Callum to receive the gift of baptism, you are entrusted with responsibilities: to live with him among God's faithful people, bring him to the word of God and the holy supper, teach him the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments, place in his hands the holy scriptures, and nurture him in faith and prayer, so that he may learn to trust God, proclaim Christ through word and deed, care for others and the world God made, and work for justice and peace. Do you promise to help Callum grow in the Christian faith and life?

Response: We do.

Stand as able

People of God, gathered here in the sanctuary and in your homes, do you promise to support Callum and pray for him in his new life in Christ? **We do.**

I ask you to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the church.

Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God? **I renounce them.**

Do you renounce the powers of this world that rebel against God? I renounce them.

Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you from God? I renounce them.

Do you believe in God the Father?

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

The Lord be with you. **And also with you.**

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

Blessed are you, O God, maker and ruler of all things. Your voice thundered over the waters at creation. You water the mountains and send springs into the valleys to refresh and satisfy all living things.

Through the waters of the flood you carried those in the ark to safety. Through the sea you led your people Israel from slavery to freedom. In the wilderness you nourished them with water from the rock, and you brought them across the river Jordan to the promised land.

By the baptism of his death and resurrection, your Son Jesus has carried us to safety and freedom. The floods shall not overwhelm us, and the deep shall not swallow us up, for Christ has brought us over to the land of promise and sends us to make disciples, baptizing in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.


Pour out your Holy Spirit; wash away sin in this cleansing water; clothe the baptized with Christ; and claim your children, no longer slave and free, no longer lonely and isolated, but one with all the baptized in Christ Jesus, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Water is poured on the child's head, as the presiding minister says: Callum James I baptize you in the name of the Father,

The presiding minister marks the sign of the cross on the forehead of the baptized. As the sign of the cross is made, the minister says:

Callum James Byrne Bialkowski, child of God, you have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever.

We welcome you into the body of Christ and into the mission we share: join us in giving thanks and praise to God and bearing God's creative and redeeming word to all the world.


Daniel 12:1-3

SECOND READING

A reading from Hebrews.

¹¹ Every other priest performs services every day and offers the same sacrifices many times; but these sacrifices can never take away sins. ¹² Christ, however, offered one sacrifice for sins, an offering that is effective forever. Then Christ sat down at the right hand of God, ¹³ and now waits there until God puts all enemies in their rightful place. ¹⁴With one sacrifice then, Jesus has made perfect forever those who are being sanctified. ¹⁹ Therefore, sisters and brothers, since the blood of Jesus makes us confident to enter the holy place ²⁰ by the new and living path opened for us through the veil—that is to say, the body of Jesus—²¹ and since we have the supreme high priest presiding over the house of God, ²² let us enter it filled with faith and with sincerity in our hearts, our hearts sprinkled and cleared from any trace of bad conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. ²³ Let us keep firm in the hope we profess, because the One who made the promise is faithful. ²⁴ Let us always think how we can stimulate each other to love and good works. ²⁵ Don't stay away from the meetings of the community, as some do, but encourage one another; and do this all the more as you see the Day drawing near.




GREAT THANKSGIVING

LORD'S PRAYER


