Dear Members of the Trinity Family,

I have been thinking about a universal truth - the way we all love to be included, the way we all want to be invited. It doesn't matter if the invitation is printed in fancy script and arrives in the mail weeks before the event, or if it is a dinner invitation that comes via text, or a casual invitation to coffee that is extended after worship on Sunday morning. It feels so good to be needed and wanted, to be included, to belong.

We all have a hunger to be recognized, to be known, to be accepted, to be loved, to be invited. It's that feeling we get when we arrive at our friends' home and are greeted with the words, "We are so glad you are here!" It's when the barista at the local coffee shop calls us by name and remembers our order. It's when the stranger stops to help us collect the carton of sodas that breaks in the grocery store parking lot. Or when someone at church scoots over, pats the pew, and says, "Come sit with me." It's the unsolicited open palm waves from little children.

In this season of Advent as we watch and wait for Christ's coming among us, we acknowledge our hunger to be invited, to be included, to be loved. We are all just a collection of heart and bones walking through this world, exchanging invitations, saying to one another in a thousand different ways - come matter here. Come make a difference here. Come be you, here. Come be loved just as you are. Come and belong with us.

Jesus did not receive much of an invitation. No one opened the door or made room on a pew or shouted words of welcome, but still Jesus came. Without fanfare or fancy invitation, Jesus chose to come among us. In this season of Advent, let's make a way for others. Let's extend invitations. Let's open our hearts and minds to include new people, new friends who, like us, are hungry to belong. Let's make a way for Jesus by making a way for others.

COUNCIL NOTES

At the November meeting of the Congregation Council, the council...
---noted that expenses for October were \$3,199 below projection;
---received an update from Trinity's COVID-19 Transition Team;
---approved the recommendation from the Stewardship Committee to adopt a budget of \$1,070,516 for 2022 and to recommend the adoption of this budget to the congregation; and
---voted unanimously to create a part-time program staff position entitled "Queer and Justice Ministry Coordinator" beginning on January 1, 2022 and to invite Patrick Preacher to assume this position.

Trinity's Covid-19 Transition Team is recommending and requesting that masks be worn by all during worship. On Sunday, December 19, at 10:00 am the congregation will worship in the Gym for the Christmas Pageant.

The first session of the Annual Meeting of the Congregation will be held immediately after worship on Sunday, November 28. At that time the proposed budget for 2022 will be introduced and nominations for Congregation Council will be finalized.

The meeting will then be recessed until 11:30 am on Sunday, December 5. On that day the Congregation will meet in the Gym to adopt a budget and elect members of the Congregation Council. The ten nominees for the five three-year terms are Tara Miller, Peggy Schotsch, Allan Downen, Gregg Alley, John Otten, Jimmy Reynolds, Bonnie Farmer, Greg Hamluk, Amy Hegarty, and Calvin Harmon. The nominees for the one-year youth term are Roger Brown and Adaline McCormack.

NURSERY FOR SUNDAY MORNING WORSHIP

A nursery is available during the 10:00 am worship service on Sunday morning. Practices and protocols follow all DHEC recommendations for daycare centers. All staff and volunteers must be fully vaccinated and wear masks at all times. A copy of the updated guidelines can be obtained through the Church Office. The age requirements for children in the nursery are flexible and fluid during this time of transition.

FAITH FORMATION

ADULT FAITH FORUM is a group that meets on Zoom on Sunday mornings from 8:00 to 9:00 am. Conversation begins at 8:00 am, with the discussion beginning at 8:15 am. All adults are welcome to participate. This group discusses current events in light of our faith as Christians. During the Advent season, the congregation is encouraged to create healthy boundaries and make space and time to watch and wait for the savior's coming among us by committing to being at home on Wednesday evenings throughout the Advent season. To assist with this effort to create peace and calm during this hectic season, beginning on Wednesday, December 1 and extending for the following three weeks (December 8, 15, and 22), a service of Holden Evening Prayer that will include a meditation will be premiered via Facebook and YouTube at 7:00 pm.
