WORD

FIRST READING

Exodus 34:29-35

A reading from Exodus.

²⁹ As Moses came down from Mount Sinai carrying the two tablets of the Covenant, he was not aware that the skin on his face was radiant from speaking with God. ³⁰ When Aaron and the other Israelites saw Moses, they were afraid to approach him because of the radiance of the skin of his face. ³¹ Only when Moses called to them did Aaron and the leaders of the community come near, and then Moses spoke to them. ³² Later, all the Israelites gathered around, and Moses gave them the instructions he had received from God on Mount Sinai. ³³ When he finished speaking to them, Moses put a veil over his face. Whenever Moses entered the presence of God, he would remove the veil until he came out again, ³⁴ and when he would come out and tell the Israelites what had been commanded, ³⁵ they would see that the skin on his face was radiant. Then he would put the veil over his face again until he went in to speak with God.

A reading from second Corinthians.

¹² With such hope we are very bold in what we say. ¹³ And we are not like Moses, who covered his face with a veil to keep the Israelites from gazing at the radiance as it faded away. ¹⁴ But their minds had been dulled, and to this day the same veil remains whenever the old Covenant is read—it has not been taken away, for only in Christ can it be removed. ¹⁵ To this day, whenever Moses is read, a veil covers their understanding. ¹⁶ But whenever anyone turns to our God, the veil is removed. ¹⁷ Now our God is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of our God is, there is freedom. ¹⁸ And we, who with unveiled faces reflect our God's glory, grow brighter and brighter as we are being transformed into the image we reflect. This is the work of our God, who is Spirit. ^{4:1} Therefore, because we have this ministry through God's mercy, we do not give in to discouragement. ² On the contrary, we renounce the shameful deeds that were kept hidden. We are not deceitful, nor do we adulterate the word of God. But by speaking the truth plainly, we commend ourselves to every person's conscience in the sight of God.

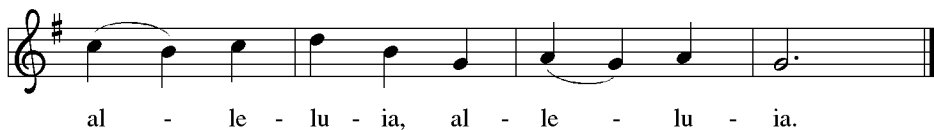
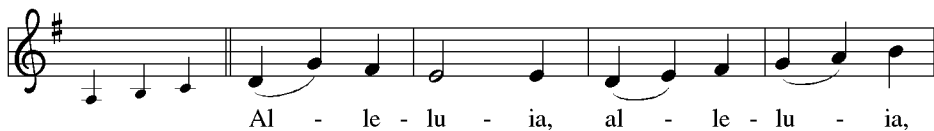

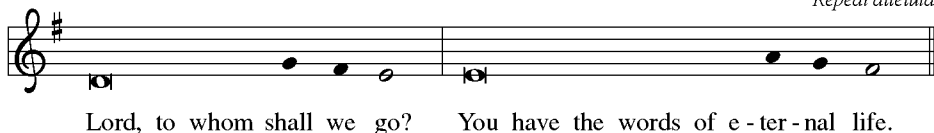

The Holy Gospel according to Saint Luke the ninth chapter.

Glorify to you, O Lord.

²⁸ About eight days after saying this, Jesus took Peter, John and James and went up onto a mountain to pray. ²⁹ While Jesus was praying, his face changed in appearance and the clothes he wore became dazzlingly white. ³⁰ Suddenly two people were there talking with Jesus—Moses and Elijah. ³¹ They appeared in glory and spoke of the prophecy that Jesus was about to fulfill in Jerusalem. ³² Peter and the others had already fallen into a deep sleep, but awakening, they saw Jesus' glory—and the two people who were standing next to him. ³³ When the two were leaving, Peter said to Jesus, "Rabbi, how good it is for us to be here! Let's set up three tents, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah!" Peter didn't really know what he was saying. ³⁴ While Peter was speaking, a cloud came and overshadowed them, and the disciples grew fearful as the others entered it. ³⁵ Then from the cloud came a voice which said, "This is my Own, my Chosen One. Listen to him!" ³⁶ When the voice finished speaking, they saw no one but Jesus standing there. The disciples kept quiet, telling nothing of what they had seen at that time to anyone. ³⁷ The following day, when they came down the mountain, a large crowd awaited him. ³⁸ A man stepped out of the crowd and said, "Teacher, please come and look at my son, my only child. ³⁹ A demon seizes him and he screams, and it throws him into convulsions until he foams at the mouth. It releases the boy only with difficulty, and when it does, he is exhausted. ⁴⁰ I begged your disciples to cast it out, but they couldn't." ⁴¹ Jesus said in reply, bring the child to me. ⁴² As the boy approached, the demon dashed the child to the ground and threw him into a violent convulsion. But Jesus reprimanded the unclean spirit, healed the child and returned him to his father. ⁴³ All present were awestruck at the greatness of God.


