

Isaiah 55:1-9

A reading from Isaiah.

¹ “All you who are thirsty, come to the water! You who have no money, come, buy food and eat! Come, buy wine and milk, without money, without price! ² Why spend your money for what is not bread, your wages for what fails to satisfy? Heed me, and you will eat well, you will delight in rich fare; ³ bend your ear and come to me, listen, that you may have life: I will make an everlasting Covenant with you in fulfillment of the blessings promised to David. ⁴ See, I have made of you to be a witness to the peoples, a leader and commander of the nations. ⁵ See, you will summon nations you never knew, and nations that never knew you will come hurrying to you for the sake of God, the Holy One of Israel, who will glorify you. ⁶ Seek me, God, while I may still be found, call upon me while I am near! ⁷ Let the corrupt abandon their ways, the evil their thoughts. Let them return to God, and I will have mercy on them; return to God, for I will freely pardon. ⁸ For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways, my ways,” says God. ⁹ “As high as the heavens are above the earth, so high are my ways above your ways and my thoughts above your thoughts.

SECOND READING

1 Corinthians 10:1-13

A reading from first Corinthians.

¹I want you to remember this: our ancestors were all under the cloud and all passed through the sea; ²by the cloud and the sea all of them were baptized into Moses. ³All ate the same spiritual food. ⁴All drank the same spiritual drink—they drank from the spiritual rock that was following them, and the rock was Christ, ⁵yet we know that God was not pleased with most of them, for “they were struck down in the desert.” ⁶These things happened as an example to keep us from evil desires such as theirs. ⁷Do not become idolators, as some of them were, for scripture says, “The people sat down to eat and drink and got up to indulge in revelry.” ⁸We must not take part in sexual immorality, as some of them did; twenty-three thousand of them died in one day. ⁹We must not test our God, as some of them did; they were killed by snakes. ¹⁰Nor are you to grumble as some of them did, for which they were killed by the destroying angel. ¹¹The things that happened to them serve as an example and have been written as a warning to us, upon whom the end of the ages has come. ¹²For all these reasons, let those who think they are standing upright watch out lest they fall! ¹³No test has overtaken you but what is common to all people. You can be confident that God is faithful and will not let you be tested beyond your means. And with any trial God will provide you with a way out of it, as well as the strength to bear the trial.

Luke 13:1-9

The Holy Gospel according to Saint Luke the thirteenth chapter.

Glorify to you, O Lord.

¹ On the same occasion, there were people present who told Jesus about some Galileans whose blood Pilate had mixed with their own sacrifices. ² Jesus replied, "Do you think these Galileans were the greatest sinners in Galilee just because they suffered this? ³ Not at all! I tell you, you'll all come to the same end unless you change your ways. ⁴ Or take those eighteen who were killed by a falling tower in Siloam. Do you think they were more guilty than anyone else who has lived in Jerusalem? ⁵ Certainly not! I tell you, you'll all come to the same end unless you change your ways." ⁶ Jesus told this parable: "There was a fig tree growing in a vineyard. ⁷ The owner came out looking for fruit on it, but didn't find any. The owner said to the vine dresser, 'Look here! For three years now I've come out in search of fruit on this fig tree and have found none. Cut it down. Why should it clutter up the ground?' ⁸ "In reply, the vine dresser said, 'Please leave it one more year while I hoe around it and fertilize it. ⁹ If it bears fruit next year, fine; if not, then let it be cut down.'"




Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
