





WORD

FIRST READING A reading from Deuteronomy.

¹ Once you have entered the land that God, your God, is giving to you as your inheritance, and you have taken possession of it and settled in it, 2 take some of the first fruits of all that you produce from the soil of the land that God, your God, is giving to you, and put them in a basket. Take them to the place which God, your God, will choose as a dwelling place for God's Name ³ and say to the priest in office at that time, "This day I declare to God, our God, that I have come to the land God swore to our ancestors to give us." ⁴ The priest will then receive the basket from you and will set it in front of the altar of God. ⁵ Then you will declare before God, "My ancestor was a wandering Aramean who went down to Egypt with a small household and lived there as an alien. There they became a nation great, strong and numerous. ⁶ When the Egyptians mistreated and oppressed us, imposing hard labor upon us, ⁷ we cried to God, the God of our ancestors, who heard our cry and saw our affliction, our toil and our oppression. ⁸ God brought us out of Egypt with a strong hand and outstretched arm, with terrifying power, with signs and wonders; ⁹ God gave us this land, a land flowing with milk and honey. ¹⁰ Therefore, I have brought now the first fruits of the products of the soil that you, O God, have given me." Then you must set them before God, and bow down before God. ¹¹ Then you all, along with the Levites, and the foreigner that live among you, will feast on all the good things that God, your God, has given to you and your household.


SECOND READING A reading from Romans. Romans 10:8b-13

^{8b}"The word is near you, on your lips and in your heart" that is, the word of faith that we proclaim; ⁹because if you confess with your lips that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. ¹⁰For one believes with the heart and so is justified, and one confesses with the mouth and so is saved. ¹¹The scripture says, "No one who believes in him will be put to shame." ¹²For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek; the same Lord is Lord of all and is generous to all who call on him. ¹³For, "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved."

GOSPEL

Luke 4:1-13

The Holy Gospel according to Saint Luke the fourth chapter. **Glory to you, O Lord.**

¹ Jesus returned from the Jordan filled with the Holy Spirit, and she led him into the desert ² for forty days, where he was tempted by the Devil. Jesus ate nothing during that time, at the end of which he was famished. ³ The Devil said to Jesus, "If you are God's Own, command this stone to turn into bread." ⁴ Jesus answered, "Scripture has it, 'We don't live on bread alone." ⁵ Then the Devil took Jesus up higher and showed him all the nations of the world in a single instant. ⁶ The Devil said, "I'll give you all the power and the glory of these nations; the power has been given to me and I can give it to whomever I wish. ⁷ Prostrate yourself in homage before me, and it will all be yours." ⁸ In reply, Jesus said, "Scripture has it: 'You will worship the Most High God; God alone will you adore." ⁹ Then the Devil led Jesus to Jerusalem, set him up on the parapet of the Temple and said, "If you are God's Own, throw yourself down from here, ¹⁰ for scripture has it, 'God will tell the angels to take care of you; ¹¹ with their hands they'll support you, that you may never stumble on a stone." ¹² Jesus said to the Devil in reply, "It also says, 'Do not put God to the test." ¹³ When the Devil had finished all this tempting, Jesus was left alone. The Devil awaited another opportunity.


GREAT THANKSGIVING


