A reading from Deuteronomy.

⁹God will make you prosper in all the work of your hands, and in the fruit of your body, of your livestock and of your lands. ¹⁰God will once again delight in you and make you prosperous, just as God delighted in your ancestors and prospered them, if you obey God, your God, and keep the commandments and decrees that are written in this Book of the Law, and return to God with all your heart and soul. ¹¹For this Law that I give to you today is not too difficult for you, nor is it beyond your reach. ¹²It is not up in heaven, so that you need to ask yourselves, "Who will go up to heaven for us and bring it down to us, so that we may hear it and keep it?" ¹³Nor is it beyond the seas, so that you need to wonder, "Who will cross the seas for us and bring it back to us, so that we may hear it and keep it?" ¹⁴No, the word of God is very near to you; it is in your mouth, and in your heart, so that you can keep it.

GOSPEL Luke 10:25-37

The Holy Gospel according to Saint Luke the tenth chapter.

Glory to you, O Lord.

²⁵ An expert on the Law stood up to put Jesus to the test and said, "Teacher, what must I do to inherit everlasting life?" ²⁶ Jesus answered, "What is written in the law? How do you read it?" ²⁷ The expert on the Law replied: "You must love the Most High God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength

and with all your mind,

and your neighbor as yourself." 28 Jesus said, "You have answered correctly. Do this and you'll live." ²⁹ But the expert on the Law, seeking self-justification, pressed Jesus further: "And just who is my neighbor?" 30 Jesus replied, "There was a traveler going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, who fell prey to robbers. The traveler was beaten, stripped naked, and left half-dead. ³¹ A priest happened to be going down the same road; the priest saw the traveler lying beside the road, but passed by on the other side. ³² Likewise there was a Levite who came the same way; this one, too, saw the afflicted traveler and passed by on the other side. 33 "But a Samaritan, who was taking the same road, also came upon the traveler and, filled with compassion, 34 approached the traveler and dressed the wounds, pouring on oil and wine. Then the Samaritan put the wounded person on a donkey, went straight to an inn and there took care of the injured one. 35 The next day the Samaritan took out two silver pieces and gave them to the innkeeper with the request, 'Look after this person, and if there is any further expense, I'll repay you on the way back.' 36 "Which of these three, in your opinion, was the neighbor to the traveler who fell in with the robbers?" 37 The answer came, "The one who showed compassion." Jesus replied, "Then go and do the same."


Lift up your hearts.

forever and ever. Amen.


