FIRST READING

Deuteronomy 30:15-20

A reading from Deuteronomy.

¹⁵ Today I have set before you life and success, or death and disaster. ¹⁶ For today I command you to love God, your God, to follow God's ways and keep the commandments, the laws and the customs. If you do, you will live and increase, and God, your God, will bless you in the land that you are entering to possess. ¹⁷ But if your hearts stray and you do not listen to me, if you let yourself be drawn into the worship of other gods, and serve them, ¹⁸ I tell you today, you will not survive. You will not live long in the land which you are ^{now} crossing the Jordan to enter and occupy. ¹⁹ I call heaven and earth to witness against you today: I set before you life or death, blessing or curse. Choose life, then, so that you and your descendants may live, ²⁰ by loving God, your God, by obeying God's voice and by clinging to God. For that will mean life for you, a long life in the land which God swore to give to your ancestors Sarah and Abraham, Rebecca and Isaac, and Leah and Rachel and Jacob.

A reading from Philemon.

¹From Paul, a prisoner for Christ Jesus, and Timothy, our brother, To Philemon, our dear friend and coworker, ² to Apphia, our sister, to Archippus, our companion in the struggle, and to the church that meets in your house: ³ Grace and peace from God and Our Savior Jesus Christ. ⁴ I always mention you in my prayers and thank God for you ⁵ because I hear of the love and faith you have for our Savior Jesus and for all the saints. ⁶ I pray that you'll be active in sharing your faith, so that you'll fully understand all the good things we're able to do for the sake of Christ. ⁷ I find great joy and comfort in your love, because through you the hearts of the holy ones have been refreshed. ⁸ Therefore, though I feel I have every right in Christ to command you to do what ought to be done, ⁹ I prefer to appeal in the name of love. Yes, I, Paul, an ambassador and now a prisoner for Christ, ¹⁰ appeal to you for my child, of whom I have become the parent during my imprisonment. He has truly become Onesimus—"Useful"—¹¹ for he who was formerly useless to you is now useful indeed both to you and to me. ¹² It is he that I am sending to you—and that means I'm sending my heart! ¹³ I had wanted to keep him with me, that he might help me in your place while I'm in prison for the Good News; ¹⁴ but I didn't want to do anything without your consent, so that kindness might not be forced on you, but be freely bestowed. ¹⁵ Perhaps he was separated from you for a while for this reason—that you might have him back forever, ¹⁶ no longer as a subordinate, but as more—a beloved brother, especially dear to me. And how much dearer he'll be to you, since now you'll know him both in the flesh and in Christ! ¹⁷ If you regard me as a partner, then, welcome Onesimus as you would me. ¹⁸ If he has done you any injury or owes you anything, charge it to me. ¹⁹ I, Paul, write this in my own hand: I agree to pay. And I won't even mention that you owe me your very self! ²⁰ You see, my friend, I want to make you "useful" to me in Christ. Refresh this heart of mine in Christ. ²¹ I write with complete confidence in your obedience, since I am sure you will do even more than I ask.

²⁵ Large crowds followed Jesus. He turned to them and said, ²⁶ “If any of you come to me without turning your back on your mother and your father, your loved ones, your sisters and brothers, indeed your very self, you can not be my follower. ²⁷ Anyone who doesn’t take up the cross and follow me can not be my disciple. ²⁸ “If one of you were going to build a tower, wouldn’t you first sit down and calculate the outlay to see if you have enough money to complete the project? ²⁹ You’d do that for fear of laying the foundation and then not being able to complete the work—because anyone who saw it would jeer at you ³⁰ and say, ‘You started a building and couldn’t finish it.’ ³¹ Or if the leaders of one country were going to declare war on another country, wouldn’t they first sit down and consider whether, with an army of ten thousand, they could win against an enemy coming against them with twenty thousand? ³² If they couldn’t, they’d send a delegation while the enemy is still at a distance, asking for terms of peace. ³³ “So count the cost. You can’t be my disciple if you don’t say goodbye to all of your possessions.
