Friends, on the night of Jesus' birth, Mary and Joseph struggled to find a place to lay their heads.

If you, like the people of Bethlehem, have ever withheld hospitality to those within reach, please cross your arms.

On the night of Jesus' birth, the wise ones traveled long and far, trying to get to Jesus.

If you have ever let your faith take a passive, backseat position in your life, failing to take the steps necessary to deepen your faith, please bow your head.

Joseph showed radical grace to Mary at a time when many would have shunned her in their disbelief.

If you have ever failed to show grace to yourself or another, please close your eyes.

Family of God, this is what sin feels like—being cut off from one another, in the dark, disconnected, and alone. However, we worship a redeeming God who pursues us even in our weakness, darkness, and estrangement.

Therefore, if you, like the shepherds, have ever looked for God's love in this world, open your eyes.

If you, like Mary, have ever treasured your neighbor as a gift from God, raise your head.

If you, like Joseph, have ever forgiven yourself or someone else, uncross your arms, and grab the hand of someone next to you.

And if your head is still bowed, your eyes still closed, or your arms still crossed, open and uncross them—for you are forgiven by the grace of God. Friends, this is what the Kin-dom of God feels like—heads up, eyes open, connected, forgiven, seen, loved. Thanks be to God for a love like that. **Amen**

GOSPEL PROCESSIONAL

Once in Royal David's City
(verse 1)

#269

Once in royal David's city stood a lowly cattle shed, where a mother laid her baby in a manger for his bed: Mary was that mother mild, Jesus Christ, her little child.

He came down to earth from heaven who is God and Lord of all, and his shelter was a stable, and his cradle was a stall; with the poor and meek and lowly, lived on earth our Savior holy.

GOSPEL Luke 2:1–20

The Holy Gospel according to Saint Luke, the second chapter.

Glory to you, O Lord.

In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. 2This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. 3All went to their own towns to be registered. 4Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. 5He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. 6While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. 7And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn. 8In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. 10But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see — I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: 11 to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. 12This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger." 13And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying,

¹⁴"Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom God favors!" ¹⁵When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us." ¹⁶So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger. ¹⁷When they saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child; ¹⁸and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. ¹⁹But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart. ²⁰The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.






