While I will greatly miss you, especially our worship life together on Sunday mornings, I know that you will be well cared for by my colleagues. During this time away I will not be responding to emails and hope to spend lots of time away from my cell phone. When you have a pastoral need, please reach out to my pastoral colleague, Jim Parham, or to Trinity's Office Manager, Kay Cook, who will be taking care of many things during my time away. I am grateful to each of you for giving me this space and time. I am already looking forward to February and to beginning again (with renewed passion and energy!) all the beautiful ministry that God is calling us to do. I will keep you all close in my prayers and would cherish your prayers for me as well.

- ---learned that council members will be installed during the 10:00 am worship service on Sunday, February 5; and
- ---expressed gratitude to outgoing council members for their faithful service and leadership to include Tom DiAntonio, Heather Kleckley, Terry Morgan, Donna Potts, and Roger Brown.

FOUNDATION GRANTS

The Trinity Lutheran Church Foundation Committee met in December to consider grant applications for 2022. Ten grants totaling \$80,000 were awarded to the following recipients:

- Generation Group Homes
 - \$12,905 to remodel two bathrooms in one of the residences for sexually abused boys
- Greenville Organized For Accountable Leadersip (GOAL)
 \$10,000 to help build a justice organization comprised of congregations that work together to tackle community problems
- Pendleton Place
 - \$4,000 to help support Emergency Youth Shelter
- Rebuild Upstate
 - \$4,595 to help complete home repair projects for low-income homeowners in Greenville
- Trinity Lutheran Church
 - \$9,000 to provide funding for sabbaticals for Trinity's three rostered leaders
- Trinity Lutheran Church
 - \$7,500 to provide scholarship assistance to Patrick Preacher for his second year of seminary
- The Homeless Period Project
 - \$10,000 to support the startup for a new SC Menstrual Equity Coalition which will work to advance statewide affordable solutions to period poverty
- United Ministries
 - \$8,000 to help provide interim housing for homeless families in Greenville
- 864Pride
 - \$7,000 to assist with Queer Wellness Center building updates and supplies for the resource closet
- PrideLink
 - \$7,000 to support LGBTQIA+ Youth Empowerment mission

With this grant cycle, The Trinity Lutheran Church Foundation has given away in excess of \$2,000,000 since 1997.
