Friends in Christ,

Our journey through February covers vast spiritual territory. We begin right where January left us, in the fifth chapter of Matthew sitting at the feet of Jesus as he delivers the Sermon on the Mount. This massive teaching event that fills chapters five, six, and seven of Matthew. Here, Matthew establishes Jesus as the *New Moses*, the one who brings a *new* Torah, a new law. Jesus reinterprets Old Testament Torah as found in Exodus, Leviticus, and Deuteronomy, into the new ethic, pattern, and mission of God's unfolding kingdom. Jesus gives a new structure for life as a disciple: radical generosity and service, a pattern of prayer as a cherished child of God, humble sincere piety, political and social dynamics based on forgiveness and mercy, patience and courage in the face of conflict and persecution.

The Sundays after Epiphany culminate on February 19 with a true mountain-top experience. The glorious Transfiguration of Jesus reveals his divine identity and glory. The voice of God reveals Jesus' identity and mission. God identifies Jesus as God's one and only child and as "the Beloved" - God's one and only faithful servant whose suffering saves the world. In an instant, our imaginations are cast forward to Holy Week, to the cross and the empty tomb, but God snaps us back into the present mission of Jesus with these final words, "Listen to him!" As Jesus' transfiguration glory fades, and we follow him back down the mountain, our attention is now fully fixed on Jesus. We are ready to enter the season of Lent.

Ash Wednesday, February 22, is our portal into the 40 days of Lent. Through confession of sin and the ashen cross on our foreheads, we freely embrace our mortality and humanity, opening ourselves to the liberating and life-giving love and grace of God. February concludes with the first Sunday in Lent, drawing us into the raw unsheltered wilderness with Jesus, who, alone and vulnerable, faces down all that seeks to turn us away from God. Now we see the true faith and power of *The Beloved*.

GREENVILLE ORGANIZED FOR ACCOUNTABLE LEADERSHIP

GOAL researchers have been meeting with social service providers throughout December and January. Problem statements are being formed as the basis for what change will be asked of specific community leaders at the Nehemiah Action event March 28.

Affordable Housing: From 2021-2022 rents in Greenville have increased by 86%, the 6th highest increase in the country. In Greenville County, over 50,000 people spend more than 30% of their income on housing and there are 1,200 homeless children.

Mental Health: Suicide is the 3rd leading cause of death for people aged 24 and under in SC and while every school in Greenville County has a licensed mental health therapist on site, not all children can utilize their services due to insurance restrictions. Many private counseling services have wait times of 6+ months for children... imagine having to wait this long to have a broken arm casted.

GOAL gathering: On Monday, February 13, there will be a gathering at Trinity from 6:00 to 7:30 pm in the Multipurpose Room for all GOAL network members and anyone passionate about social justice in the Greenville community.
