Dear Members of the Trinity Family,

Each and every morning as I rise from sleep and prepare to begin a new day, I pause to consider the "new thing" that God will do in my life and in our life together at Trinity. If our eyes and ears and hearts are open, each day God will gift us with something new - a fresh, new perspective, a relationship with a new person, clarity of vision and mission, affirmation of meaningful, long-held traditions, as well as new ways of seeing, doing, and being that will shine love and light into our life together and into the world.

What "new" thing is God doing in your life? What "old" thing will you have to release in order to embrace the "new" thing? What about our life together at Trinity? What old way of seeing, doing, and believing will we as a community have to release in order to embrace the new thing that God is doing among us? It's definitely about balance. We need some of the long-standing, ancient traditions of the church that have stood the test of time. We also need new ideas, fresh perspectives, transformation, new ways of seeing, doing, and believing if we are to move into the beautiful future God has prepared for us. A period of discernment is required to find a way forward, to decide which "old" things to hold on to and which "new" things to embrace. It's not going to happen quickly. It will require open hearts and minds; significant amounts of love and patience.

These final days of Lent as we prepare for Holy Week and the celebration of the resurrection are the ideal time for discernment. Easter reminds us that some things must die so that other things can live. Death must precede resurrection. An ending always leads to a new beginning. My hope and prayer is that together we will have the strength, courage, wisdom, and grace to hold on to the traditions that bring meaning and value and to embrace the new practices and rituals that bring life, hope, connection, and belonging. We need both - the old and the new. May God give us the wisdom for faithful discernment.

COUNCIL NOTES

At the March meeting of the Congregation Council, the council...

- ---received a report from the Treasurer noting that expenses for February were \$2,270 more than projected;
- ---affirmed the recent addition of Angie McCormack, Trinity's new Youth and Children's Ministry Coordinator, to the staff;
- ---received a report from the 429 Task Group noting that a scope of work is being developed in anticipation of the submission of bids with regard to the front portion of the 429 North Main Property. The Task Group is focused on potential monetization of the property as well as social purpose uses;
- ---learned that the next step toward the installation of the rebuilt organ will require an amended contract that is currently being negotiated; and
- ---learned that the Stewardship Committee is beginning work on the 2024 budget with regard to income and expenses, with the knowledge that the 2024 ministry plan will likely require significant adjustments to meet the changing needs of mission and ministry.

NOTES ON WORSHIP

Since Holy Week and Easter services were held in the Gym in 2022, Holy Week and Easter services will be held in the Sanctuary this year. At their most recent meeting, the Worship Committee made the decision to continue with one service at 10:00 am on Sunday mornings and that the service would occur in either the Gym or the Sanctuary, with the worship location being determined based upon the needs of each Sunday's service and the desire to be in both locations on an equal basis. The hope is that once critical mass is achieved to support two services, a new worship schedule that includes two opportunities to worship will be available on Sunday mornings.
