

³⁴Peter began to speak to the people: "I truly understand that God shows no partiality, ³⁵but in every nation anyone who fears God and does what is right is acceptable to God. ³⁶You know the message God sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace through Jesus Christ—Lord of all. ³⁷That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: ³⁸how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. ³⁹We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; ⁴⁰but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, ⁴¹not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, and who ate and drank with Christ Jesus after he rose from the dead. ⁴²Christ commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. ⁴³All the prophets testify about Christ Jesus that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."

GOSPEL Matthew 28:1-10

The Holy Gospel according to Saint Matthew, the twenty-eighth chapter. **Glory to you, O Lord.**

¹After the sabbath, early in the morning on the first day of the week while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to see the tomb. ²And suddenly there was a great earthquake; for an angel of the Lord, descending from heaven, came and rolled back the stone and sat on it. ³The angel's appearance was like lightning, with clothing white as snow. ⁴For fear of the angel the guards shook and became like the dead. ⁵But the angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid; I know that you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. ⁶He is not here; for he has been raised, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay. ⁵Then go quickly and tell his disciples, 'Jesus has been raised from the dead, and indeed he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him.' This is my message for you." ⁵So they left the tomb quickly with fear and great joy, and ran to tell his disciples. ⁵Suddenly Jesus met them and said, "Greetings!" 
Lift up your hearts.

In the fullness of time, you sent your chosen servant to preach good news to the afflicted, to break bread with the outcast and despised, and to ransom those in bondage to prejudice and sin.


