Dear Siblings in Christ,

Since my entire professional life has been spent working in the church (and for a few years also as an elementary school teacher), August always has a rhythm and energy all its own. Time, its value, its relentless passage, and how to steward what time I have always intensifies in August.

August is a transitional month for many others as well, such as families with school-age children, school staff, and the businesses and services that support them. College and university communities transition to fall schedules. Students return to campus and activity ramps up. South Carolina farmers gear up for the corn harvest, and many business owners prepare for a busy fall season. Summer is running out and the heavy demands of the fall loom large. Even before Covid drove uncertainty and anxiety off the charts sending the world's mental health into the dumpster, some were already calling the kind of anxiety common to this time of year "August Anxiety" or "August Blues."

In addition, some of us endure heavy burdens that have little to do with the month or the season. Our queer siblings face relentless and insidious threats to their safety and welfare. Many close to us reel from a cancer diagnosis, struggle to rehab from a heart attack or stroke, walk with the heavy grief from losing a loved one, and live with the unresolvable panic of unemployment and relentless debt. Time, its value, its relentless passage, the fear of losing it, and what to do becomes almost overwhelming.

Throughout August, we encounter Gospel stories that drive right to the heart of our feelings of anxiety and helplessness before the threats, expectations and demands of daily life. We see Jesus bringing healing, salvation, and nourishment to desperate, fearful, hopeless people. My August prayer for us is that we remain *ever mindful* that the one who fed thousands with a few pieces of bread and fish, who calmed the angry heavens and seas with a word, and who broke through ageless, petrified walls of hate and cultural bigotry to bring healing and salvation to a child, this one, Jesus the Messiah, is with you and me all the way.

Why do we call this investing? Because there is a real, measurable return on your investing. In year one of GOAL Justice's operation in Greenville, through grass roots people power organizing in over 20 congregations, voices were heard. State funding is now in place to make sure every 988 call in South Carolina receives an in-state response and legislation has passed allowing cities and counties to use accommodations tax dollars for housing!

At the local level a majority of city council is committed to working towards a goal of providing \$10,000,000 of funding to the housing fund, with the Mayor specifically identifying funding sources. The County Council has proposed investing \$5,000,000 over the next two years towards affordable housing. More work is needed to measurably impact the affordable housing crisis but these are positive changes that are happening because so many showed up (170+ from Trinity) at the Nehemiah Action.

On behalf of all those seeking social justice and equity in our community, thank you.
