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My siblings in Christ,

Is it July, already? Why, after 63 years of Julys, do I continue to greet this month as if it snuck up on me? In all seriousness, I truly love the month of July, even with its notorious "dog days." The ancient Romans gave us "dog days" for the 40-day period of hottest summer weather, because the star, Sirius, also known as the "dog star," rises and sets with the sun like clockwork this time of year. People began taking note of this thousands of years ago, so Sirius has long factored heavily into the mythology, religion, and agriculture of civilizations.

July's dog days bring us abundant daylight, sunshine, and heat, and these offer both benefits and challenges. Those occasional long stretches of 100+ degree temperatures are oppressive and even dangerous for many and disastrous for many crops and gardens. On the other hand, July's abundant daylight and generous sunshine are *good medicine* for many of us. For me in particular, July is a call into the great outdoors to touch and be touched by God's creation.

Though I am blessed to live and work in sturdy well-made structures, nothing nourishes my mind, body, spirit, and emotional health like time in direct contact with creation. Walls, a ceiling, synthetic lights are replaced by a color-changing sky, traced by birds and insects, and articulated by clouds of varied shapes, dimensions, and colors. My office and living room become a forest, meadow, garden, or pasture. My floor is sand, stone, earth, decaying vegetation, or ground-covering plants. I am accompanied by plants and living creatures all busy with life. The smells of the city fade into nature's infinite variety of living scents. The noise of civilization fades and the music of creation abounds: wind in the trees, rain and thunder from a summer storm, water moving through a stream or lapping against a shore, the nourishing roar of the ocean, and the infinite sonic variety of God's living creatures.

My prayer for each of us this July is that God grant us abundant time and opportunity to be refreshed, nourished, challenged, strengthened, and brought peace in God's good creation.

More work is needed to measurably impact the affordable housing crisis but these are positive changes that are happening because so many showed up (170+ from Trinity) at the Nehemiah Action.
