Dear Members of the Trinity Family,

Several recent events have prompted me to reflect upon the almost seven years since Trinity began the intentional effort to become a more inclusive, welcoming congregation. This coming February will be seven years since Trinity's Congregation Council appointed a task group to study and evaluate Trinity's Wedding Policy, specifically with regard to same gender marriage. The lay members of this team modelled and continue to model brave, bold leadership in our life together. Rachel Balck, John Beckford, Dale Hamann, Richard Moose, Amanda Mast, and Merry Mulcahy, through prayer, study, and a genuine desire to be faithful disciples, helped change the trajectory of our more than one hundred-year-old community of faith. Supported by this team's leadership, the council made the brave decision to begin celebrating same-gender marriage in May, 2017. What a journey this has been! These seven years have held their share of heartbreak, challenge, joy, celebration, and transformation. I often describe this journey as "waterskiing behind a boat driven by the Holy Spirit."

At this almost seven-year mark, we have turned a significant corner. New people find their way to Trinity every Sunday morning to hear the good news of God's love in Christ for everyone, no exceptions. At the Congregation Council meeting in August, the council made the decision to begin two new ministry partnerships - one with the Greenville Gay Men's Chorus and the second with Girl Scout Troop #3475, an inclusive and affirming troop eager for a home in an inclusive and affirming church. How these decisions fill my heart (and the heart of Christ) with joy, hope, love, and gratitude!

I am convinced that the more we welcome, include, affirm, and celebrate beloved children of God who at first glance seem so different, the larger our individual and communal capacity to love becomes. That's what I want for my life...a larger capacity to love. That's also my prayer for our life together. May God continue to bless, strengthen, and sustain us as we continue to embrace Christ's mission of inclusion, hospitality, and radical welcome.

GREENVILLE ORGANIZED FOR ACCOUNTABLE LEADERSHIP

In the first year of GOAL's existence, a real difference was made in justice by getting the 988 mental health crisis line fully funded and securing financial commitments from Greenville City and County Council to collectively provide \$10,000,000 of funding to the Affordable Housing Fund.

September brings the start of the second year and a fresh cycle of GOAL activity that begins with House Meetings where participants share the experiences of injustice that they have witnessed. This sharing paves the way for the November Community Problems Assembly where a vote on the issue will add to our efforts to bring justice and equity to our community. Please anticipate an invitation to a House Meeting from a fellow Trinity member and accept the invitation to learn more about GOAL or continue association with GOAL.

Last year over 1,500 community members in Greenville came together in the spring for the Nehemiah Action where eyes were opened and commitment was gained from elected officials. These 1,500 members came from 18 congregations. This year over 22 congregations that are a part of GOAL and through continued grass roots organizing, there is hope to have over 2,000 community members at the spring 2024 Nehemiah Action. This accumulation of people power is how the systemic issues plaguing our community are addressed.

THE WELCOME TABLE

It has been over three years since Nourishing Neighbors began. In that time, Trinity has built and strengthened many beautiful relationships with our downtown neighbors, particularly those living at Towers East. In an effort to continue moving toward a relational/partnership style of ministry with our community rather than mercy ministry, the Outreach Committee and staff are excited to revision this ministry with our neighbors. The Welcome Table, the new name for this new ministry, will occur one Wednesday per month. Those right here on this block will be invited to the Multipurpose Room to share in lunch and community building. This includes residents and staff of Towers East, unhoused neighbors, the Trinity family, Lutheran Services of the Carolinas, Lutheran Hospice, and any others in the community who might find their way to our doors. For this first event, a simple prayer service will follow the meal together. Future months may include time for board games, simple crafts, or presentations by a community service provider. All guests are invited to bring non-

perishable food items to contribute to the pantry and to then also take what they might need from the food pantry. Produce and toilet paper will also be available for those who need it. The Welcome Table begins Wednesday, September 20. Doors will open at 11:00 am with a meal being served at 11:30 am. All are welcome! Please let the Church Office know if you plan to attend.
