Then the Sovereign GoD will wipe away the tears from all faces, and the disgrace of God's people will be taken away from all the earth, for GoD has spoken.





And he was speechless. 13Then the Ruler said to the servants, 'Bind him hand and foot, and throw him into the outer darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.' 14For many are called, but few are chosen."




