Dear Members of the Trinity Family,

My grandmother (lovingly called "Mamagrand" by my siblings and cousins) was a woman of gratitude and generosity. Her husband died suddenly when he was a young man leaving her to raise three little children on her own. She was an educator and taught at Little Mountain Elementary School for fifty years. For all my growing up I sat next to my Mamagrand in worship on Sunday morning. She brought butterscotch candies and let me snuggle close to her throughout the service. She was the first to teach me about generosity.

Every Sunday she pulled out her checkbook to make her weekly offering to God's work in the congregation that nurtured and blessed me. She was a joyous giver, a cheerful giver. She was thankful for her home, her family, her career as a teacher, thankful that she lived close enough to school and church to walk and never felt the need for a driver's license. She believed that giving was the natural response to gratitude. Her weekly gifts often involved sacrifice, but she never seemed hesitant or burdened by giving. "God has given me so much. It's my pleasure to give back," she would say.

My grandmother is on my mind as we approach Consecration Sunday and the Celebration Lunch on Sunday, October 8. The day begins with worship at 10:00 am in the Sanctuary followed by a Celebration Lunch in the Gym. It is going to be a beautiful day of gratitude and generosity and will be even more meaningful if you are present. # COUNCIL NOTES

At the September meeting of the Congregation Council, the council...

---noted that expenses for August are \$9,445 less than anticipated;

---approved a recommendation from the 429 Task Group to enter into a contractual (listing) agreement with Reedy Commercial to minimally sell the 429 parcel and consider the sale of the 429 parcel and a portion of the adjacent parking lot accessible from Townes Street (requires approval of congregation);

---approved a motion from the Stewardship Committee to recommend to the congregation the adoption of the Sustainability Asset Management Plan, contingent on the approval of the listing for sale of the 429 property (details forthcoming);

---approved a motion that council recommend that the congregation ratify Phase 2 of the addendum to the organ contract (details forthcoming);

---approved a motion to share the facility with *Moms Demand Action for Gun Sense in America* to host a community educational event in November;

---appointed Greg Hamluk, Calvin Harmon, Melissa Kolb (chair), Jimmy Reynolds, Kerry Sease, and Pastor Crowell to serve on the Nominating Committee for Congregation Council; and

---voted to call a meeting of the Congregation for Sunday, October 29 in the Gym at 11:45 am to act on the following recommendations;

- 1. Listing the 429 Parcel and associated property for sale;
- 2. Ratifying Phase 2 of the Organ Contract Addendum;
- 3. Adopting the Sustainabilty Asset Management Proposal; and
- 4. Authorizing the Executive Committee to manage and execute items #1, #2, and #3.



## THE FESTIVAL OF ALL SAINTS
