Dear Members and Friends of the Trinity Family,

There is something about the season of Autumn that deeply touches my soul. It's the cooler weather, the colorful leaves, early morning walks, and the pleasure of wrapping myself in a soft blanket in a comfy chair to read a book. I am an Autumn person. I love fall décor, everything pumpkin spice, freshly picked apples, and homemade pumpkin muffins. My love for Autumn runs deep and is filled with meaning.

In these final months of the year, the trees are showing us how lovely it is to let things go. The fall leaves make letting go look so easy. The leaves release their grip on the tree and freely fall to the ground. I wish it were this simple for us to let go of the things that no longer serve us. 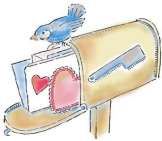


## OUT TO LUNCH BUNCH
