For years I have dreamed of having a huge closet with lots of space, but lately I am finding that I am happier with a smaller space, with fewer options for what to wear. We have one television in our home, and it is quite small by most standards, but it is enough. It is exactly what we need. It is precisely what we want.

Every now and then I do look at others and envy their homes or their families or their physical appearance, but mostly I am content, content with the life and the body and the home and the relationships that God has given to me. With contentment comes peace, and peace has always been one of my greatest desires. Are you content? Are you satisfied with the life God has given you? If not, what changes could you make that would bring contentment? As we draw closer to Holy Week, let's examine our lives. Let's express gratitude. Let's strive for contentment.

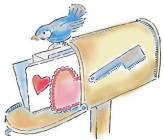
