Dear Members of the Trinity Family,

One of my favorite visual symbols for God is a circle with straight lines radiating out from the circle, looking much like a child's drawing of the sun. The symbol reminds us that God is always reaching out in love. As followers of Christ we embody God's love when we practice loving-kindness toward ourselves and others.

There are many people in my life for whom I find it easy to extend love and kindness. This includes the people I love, the people that love me, the people who see the world from a similar perspective, who desire justice, peace, and equity for all. But what about the people who do not love me, do not support me, the ones who see the world so differently? How shall I extend love and kindness to them? How shall we as a community of faith extend love and kindness to those who do not share our opinions, our view of life, our political leanings, our hopes for a broken world?

During the Easter season I will be practicing a loving-kindness meditation. I invite you to join me in this practice. First, radiate loving-kindness toward yourself: May I be safe. May I be well. May I be happy. May I be peaceful and at ease. Then, bring to mind someone you love and care about: May you be safe. May you be well. May you be happy. May you be peaceful and at ease. Next, radiate loving-kindness to someone with whom you have a difficult relationship: May you be safe. May you be well. May you be happy. May you be peaceful and at ease. Then, use your imagination to extend loving-kindness in more specific, inclusive ways, like this: May teachers and students be safe at school. May those struggling with anxiety and depression be well. May those who grieve be happy. May parents, weary from worrying about their children, be peaceful and at ease.

During these fifty days of Easter may God give us the courage and strength to practice loving-kindness for all.
