GOSPEL John 10:11-18

The Holy Gospel according to Saint John the tenth chapter.

Glory to you, O Lord.

[Jesus said:] ¹¹"I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. ¹²The hired hand, who is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away—and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. ¹³The hired hand runs away because a hired hand does not care for the sheep. ¹⁴I am the good shepherd. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic church.

We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

We pray especially for those we name now on our lips or silently in our hearts ... God of grace,

hear our prayer.

Gracious God, help this and all communities of faith to listen for your voice. Call us away from things that distract us from following you. Invite us to more deeply love and serve people who are lonely, isolated, and on the margins. God of grace,

hear our prayer.

Inclusive God, we live in a world that pits different groups of people against each other, causing inequity and anguish. When people of minority races, the queer community, women, and other people on the margins of society suffer, we know you suffer. Through your Spirit, transform fear and prejudice into compassion, kindness, empathy and respect. Gift us with the qualities that strengthen our relationships with each other and affirm the goodness of God's creation. Help us to know how very good and pleasant it is when kindred live together in unity. God of grace,

hear our prayer.

Living God, we give thanks for our ancestors in faith who shared the gospel without trepidation. Strengthen us to share the good news in our own day. God of grace,

hear our prayer.

Into your hands, most merciful God, we commend all for whom we pray, trusting in your abiding love; through Jesus Christ, our resurrected and living Lord.


Lift up your hearts.



At the direction of the ushers, worshippers are invited to move to the front of the center aisle to dip the bread into the wine to receive Communion by intinction.
