Thanksgiving for Baptism

All may make the sign of the cross, the sign that is marked at baptism, as the presiding minister begins.

Blessed be the holy Trinity, + one God, the wellspring of grace, our Easter and our joy. **Amen.**

Here is our water of life! Alleluia!

Immersed in the promises of baptism, let us give thanks for what God has done for us. We give you thanks, O God, for in the beginning your voice thundered over the deep and water became the essence of life. Adam and Eve beheld Eden's verdant rivers. The ark carried your creation through the flood into a new day. Miriam led the dancing as your people passed through the sea into freedom's land. In a desert pool the Ethiopian eunuch entered your boundless baptismal life and grace.

At the river your beloved Son was baptized by John and anointed with the Holy Spirit. By the baptism of Jesus' death and resurrection you opened the floodgates of your reconciling love, freeing us to live as Easter people. 
FIRST READING Acts 8:26-40

A reading from Acts.

²⁶An angel of the Lord said to Philip, "Get up and go toward the south to the road that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza." (This is a wilderness road.) 27So he got up and went. Now there was an Ethiopian eunuch, a court official of the Candace, queen of the Ethiopians, in charge of her entire treasury. They had come to Jerusalem to worship ²⁸and was returning home; seated in a chariot, they were reading the prophet Isaiah. ²⁹Then the Spirit said to Philip, "Go over to this chariot and join it." ³⁰So Philip ran up to it and heard them reading the prophet Isaiah. Philip asked, "Do you understand what you are reading?" 31The eunuch replied, "How can I, unless someone guides me?" And they invited Philip to get in and sit beside them. ³²Now the passage of the scripture that they were reading was this: "Like a sheep led to the slaughter, and like a lamb silent before its shearer, the one does not open their mouth. ³³In humiliation justice was denied them. Who can describe their generation? For their life was taken away from the earth." ³⁴The eunuch asked Philip, "About whom, may I ask you, does the prophet say this, about themself or about someone else?" 35Then Philip began to speak, and starting with this scripture, he proclaimed to them the good news about Jesus. ³⁶As they were going along the road, they came to some water; and the eunuch said, "Look, here is water! What is to prevent me from being baptized?" 38The eunuch commanded the chariot to stop, and both of them, Philip and the eunuch, went down into the water, and Philip baptized them. ³⁹When they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord snatched Philip away; the eunuch saw him no more, and went on the way rejoicing. 40But Philip found himself at Azotus, and as he was passing through the region, he proclaimed the good news to all the towns until he came to Caesarea.

SECOND READING 1 John 4:7-21

A reading from first John.

Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God; everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. 8Whoever does not love does not know God, for God is love. 9God's love was revealed among us in this way: God sent God's only Son into the world so that we might live through Christ. 10In this is love, not that we loved God but that God loved us and sent God's Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. 11Beloved, since God loved us so much, we also ought to love one another. 12No one has ever seen God; if we love one another, God lives in us, and God's love is perfected in us. 13By this we know that we abide in God and God in us, because God's Spirit has been given to us. 14And we have seen and do testify that Abba God has sent the Son as the Savior of the world. 15God abides in those who confess that Jesus is the Son of God, and they abide in God. 16So we have known and believe the love that God has for us. God is love, and those who abide in love abide in God, and God abides in them. 17Love has been perfected among us in this: that we may have boldness on the day of judgment, because as God is, so are we in this world. ¹⁸There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear; for fear has to do with punishment, and whoever fears has not reached perfection in love. ¹⁹We love because God first loved us. ²⁰Those who say, "I love God," and hate their own siblings, are liars; for those who do not love a sibling whom they have seen, cannot love God whom they have not seen. 21The commandment we have from God is this: those who love God must love their siblings also.

GOSPEL John 15:1-8

The Holy Gospel according to Saint John the fifteenth chapter.

Glory to you, O Lord.

Jesus said: "I am the true vine, and my Abba is the vinegrower, 2who removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit God prunes to make it bear more fruit. "You have already been cleansed by the word that I have spoken to you. Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing. Whoever does not abide in me is thrown away like a branch and withers; such branches are gathered, thrown into the fire, and burned. If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask for whatever you wish, and it will be done for you.

8My Abba God is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples."

God of grace,

hear our prayer.

We pray for all those in need: for any experiencing homelessness or unemployment, for those fleeing from oppression or seeking asylum, and for all who are ill or suffering, especially those we name now on our lips or silently in our hearts... God of grace, hear our prayer.

We pray for this congregation: for the caring ministries of this faith community, for all who visit and minister to one another, for all who take food to grieving families, and for all who seek to share the good news of your love with the world. God of grace,

hear our prayer.

We pray for those who often go unheard: for single parents, victims of sexual, spiritual, or physical abuse, for the queer community, and for all who are often forgotten. Bless those who take risks and incur costly repercussions for the sake of justice, their conscience, and the gospel. Continue bringing your kin-dom among us. God of grace, **hear our prayer.**

We pray for those who yearn for your good news: for any who have been told they are unworthy of your grace and love, for ministers who wrongly withhold sacraments and gospel, and for the church which often loses its way. Inspire us by the actions and words of the Ethiopian Eunuch. Help us to see beyond the worldly constructs of gender, class, and race so that we might understand that water gets all of us equally wet. Teach us to know what the Eunuch instinctively knew that nothing could separate them from your love. God of grace,

hear our prayer.

We pray and give thanks for the new organ being installed into our Sanctuary. Bless the hands of David, Randy, Carmen, Chris, Seth, and Alexander as they work to build what we are witnessing as a true work of art. We give you thanks for each pipe, lever, and piston lovingly being placed. And also with you.


Lift up your hearts.



COMMUNION

All, without exception, are welcome at the table of God's grace and love. Anyone preferring not to receive the wine may receive only the bread, completely trusting that the full benefit of communion — Christ's grace and forgiveness — may be found in either the bread or wine.

At the direction of the ushers, worshippers are invited to move to the front of the center aisle to dip the bread into the wine to receive Communion by intinction.
