
FIRST READING Acts 4:32-35

SECOND READING 1 John 1:1--2:2

A reading from first John.

¹We declare to you what was from the beginning, what we have heard, what we have seen with our eyes, what we have looked at and touched with our hands, concerning the word of life—²this life was revealed, and we have seen it and testify to it, and declare to you the eternal life that was with Abba God and was revealed to us—³we declare to you what we have seen and heard so that you also may have fellowship with us; and truly our fellowship is with Abba God and with the Son Jesus Christ. ⁴We are writing these things so that our joy may be complete. This is the message we have heard from him and proclaim to you, that God is light in whom dwells no darkness at all. ⁶If we say that we have fellowship with God while we are walking in darkness, we lie and do not do what is true; ¬but if we walk in the light as God is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus cleanses us from all sin. ⁶If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. ⁶If we confess our sins, God who is faithful and just will forgive us our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness. ¹OIf we say that we have not sinned, we make God a liar, and God's word is not in us.

^{2:1}My little children, I am writing these things to you so that you may not sin. But if anyone does sin, we have an advocate with God, Jesus Christ the righteous; ²and he is the atoning sacrifice for our sins, and not for ours only but also for the sins of the whole world.



GOSPEL ACCLAMATION



GOSPEL John 20:19-31

The Holy Gospel according to Saint John the twentieth chapter.

Glory to you, O Lord.

¹⁹When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Temple Authorities, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." 20 After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw Jesus. 21He said to them again, "Peace be with you. As Abba God has sent me, so I send you." 22When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. 23If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained." ²⁴But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. ²⁵So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But Thomas said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe." ²⁶A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." 27Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe." ²⁸Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" ²⁹Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe." 30Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. ³¹But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Bless those who work difficult and long hours to care for the sick, dying, injured, and at-risk. God of grace,

hear our prayer.

Your children cry out, O God, and you listen. Hear your people crying out for justice, for an end to racism and oppression based on gender. Safeguard the queer community against bigotry and hateful legislation. We long for a world where all are fed and safe. Encourage local congregations, community leaders, and advocates as we prepare for GOAL's Nehemiah Action on April 15. Make a way for silenced voices to be heard and equity to be the order of the day. God of grace,

hear our prayer.

Your beloved cry out, O God, and you listen. Where there is sickness and pain, bring peace and relief. Walk alongside those who are grieving the loss of a loved one, a difficult medical diagnosis, or a fractured relationship. We pray for all who cry out in suffering or pain, especially those we name now on our lips or silently in our hearts God of grace, hear our prayer.

Your congregations cry out, O God, and you listen. Renew pastors, leaders, musicians, staff, administrators, and volunteers who facilitated Holy Week and Easter worship in this place. Open our hearts to discern where God calls each of us to be of service to the gospel. Make a way for new and unknown gifts to be shared in unexpected ways. God of grace,

hear our prayer.

Accept our gratitude, O God, for the lives of those who now rest in you, especially Dietrich Bonhoeffer on the anniversary of his death. With thanks for all whose lives have been given in faithfulness to the gospel, grant us your peace amid our fears. God of grace, **hear our prayer.**

Into your hands, most merciful God, we commend all for whom we pray, trusting in your abiding love; through Jesus Christ, our resurrected and living Lord.

And also with you.


Lift up your hearts.


