⁵We do not proclaim ourselves; we proclaim Jesus Christ as Lord and ourselves as your slaves for Jesus' sake. ⁶For it is the God who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.

⁷But we have this treasure in clay jars, so that it may be made clear that this extraordinary power belongs to God and does not come from us. ⁸We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; ⁹persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed; ¹⁰always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be made visible in our bodies. ¹¹For while we live, we are always being given up to death for Jesus' sake, so that the life of Jesus may be made visible in our mortal flesh. ¹²So death is at work in us, but life in you.



GOSPEL

The Holy Gospel according to Saint Mark the second and third chapters. **Glory to you, O Lord.**

²³One sabbath [Jesus] was going through the grainfields; and as they made their way his disciples began to pluck heads of grain. ²⁴The Pharisees said to him, "Look, why are they doing what is not lawful on the sabbath?" ²⁵And Jesus said to them, "Have you never read what David did when he and his companions were hungry and in need of food? ²⁶ David entered the house of God, when Abiathar was high priest, and ate the bread of the Presence, which it is not lawful for any but the priests to eat, and he gave some to his companions." ²⁷Then Jesus said to them, "The sabbath was made for humankind, and not humankind for the sabbath; ²⁸so the Son of Man is lord even of the sabbath." ^{3:1}Again Jesus entered the synagogue, and a man was there who had a withered hand. ²The Pharisees watched him to see whether he would cure him on the sabbath, so that they might accuse him. ³And Jesus said to the man who had the withered hand, "Come forward." 4Then he said to the Pharisees, "Is it lawful to do good or to do harm on the sabbath, to save life or to kill?" But they were silent. ⁵Jesus looked around at them with anger; he was grieved at their hardness of heart and said to the man, "Stretch out your hand." The man stretched it out, and his hand was restored. 6The Pharisees went out and immediately conspired with the Herodians against him, how to destroy him.

This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, O Christ.**

Guide this world toward your peace, especially in Palestine and Israel, Iran, Myanmar, Iraq, Haiti, Russia and Ukraine. Merciful God, **receive our prayer.**

Provide wholeness and respite to all who are weary, those who struggle in any way, and those who care for them. We pray especially for those we now name on our lips or silently in our hearts..... Strengthen health care workers in their times of exhaustion or frustration. Protect pilots, flight attendants, bus drivers, toll workers, and others in the travel industry as they cope with the demands of summer travel. Merciful God, **receive our prayer.**

Stir our hearts toward abundant generosity among neighbors who experience hunger and food insecurity. Bless Feed 'n Seed Company, Project Host, Loaves and Fishes, Harvest Hope Food Bank, and all other organizations in Greenville who support the hungry. Help community gardens to flourish and bring abundance to farmer's markets. Open both our hearts and our tables to reflect your generosity. Merciful God, **receive our prayer**.

Move those celebrating LGBTQIA+ Pride month toward a true spirit of inclusion, equity, and justice for members of the queer community. As this congregation celebrates Pride month, we pray for LGBTQIA+ pastors, deacons, seminarians, faith leaders, and lay people within the Body of Christ. We pray especially for Reconciling in Christ congregations and seminaries, that they will continue to be strengthened and renewed to minister your gospel in bold and inclusive ways. Merciful God, **receive our prayer.**

As congregations of the South Carolina Synod gather virtually for Synod Assembly on Saturday, we ask you to fill the virtual space and each physical space with your Spirit. GREAT THANKSGIVING


The Lord is with you. **And also with you.**


