Organ Project Update

On April 24, the installation of the organ began. Many thanks to those who helped with carrying organ components from the truck into the Sanctuary. At some point during the month of May, it is anticipated the organ will speak for the first time in over three years. Construction is expected to continue into the middle of May, with several additional weeks of pipe voicing to follow. This phase of work provides the first of two case towers and the ability to access a substantial percentage of the final instrument.
