At the August meeting of the Congregation Council, the council...

---participated in a spiritual gifts activity;

---received a report from the Treasurer noting that expenses for July were \$5,759 above projections;

---learned that one offer on the 429 property has been received, another offer is in the works, a survey of the property is pending, and a real estate attorney has been retained; ---learned that beginning September 1, Lutheran Homes of South Carolina will be leasing space on a month-to-month basis, pending the sale of the 429 property;

---lifted up the need for a thorough update of Trinity's website;

---discussed the desire to move forward with a strategic planning process; and ---expressed concern about the lack of faith formation programming for children as well as the desire to provide childcare for all activities and events in an effort to make it more convenient for families with young children to participate in programming.

September 2024 marks the one year anniversary of TLC's Praying for Possibilities ministry.
