In this Advent season I am giving thanks for the community we share together at Trinity. I am thankful for the many efforts we are making to create safe, courageous spaces for more and more people. I am happy and proud of the importance Trinity places on the significance of belonging. Everyone needs a place where they can be fully and authentically themselves and know that they are loved, that they belong. For so many, Trinity is becoming that place.

The African concept of *ubuntu* means: I see you. You exist. I care for you. I am because you are. I am because we are. *Ubuntu* describes the significance of the relationships we share together in this community of faith. (If and when I finally muster the courage to get a small tattoo on my wrist, the word *Ubuntu* is one of my top choices.)

The season of Advent is a time to keep watch, take care, and realize the profound truth that you are your neighbor, and your neighbor is you. We are bound to one another. We are each other's keeper. When you tug on one thread, another is affected. The choices you make, the choices we make, influence everyone else.

During these weeks of Advent, what if we all practiced really seeing each other, seeing one another's struggles, frailties, places of deep woundedness and need? And what if we responded to that? What if we started noticing things? Who is grieving? Who is sick? Who is lonely? Who is despairing? Who is feeling disconnected from the community? Who is choosing to isolate themselves from the community? What if you reached out with a text, a note, a phone call? How might focusing on the "we" instead of the "I" in these days of Advent help transform us into the individuals and the community God is calling us to be?

May you love and care for one another. May you see the connections we share. May you use this Advent season to shine love and light into this faith community and beyond.

COUNCIL NOTES

At the November meeting of the Congregation Council, the council...

- ---noted that expenses for the month of October were \$9,496. above projections;
- ---approved the recommendation from the Stewardship Committee to adopt a budget of \$1,144,830 for 2025 and to recommend the adoption of this budget to the congregation;
- ---heard a report from the Education Committee about plans to begin offering Faith Formation classes for children at 9:00 am on Sunday mornings beginning on January 26;
- ---received a report from the Executive Committee noting that Mark Tidsworth of Pinnacle Leadership Associates will be leading Trinity's Strategic Planning Process;
- ---received an update on the 429 Property noting that a proposal is anticipated in the near future; and
- ---engaged in a significant and meaningful discussion on the topics of governance, transparency, and power structures in the life of the Trinity family.

ANNUAL MEETING OF THE CONGREGATION

The first session of the Annual Meeting of the Congregation will be held immediately after worship in the Sanctuary on Sunday, December 1. At this time the proposed budget for 2025 will be presented and nominees for Congregation Council will be introduced.

The meeting will then stand in recess until 11:30 am on Sunday, December 8 when the congregation will meet after worship in the Gym to adopt a budget for 2025 and to elect members of Congregation Council. The ten nominees for the five three-year terms are Carl Brune, Jaime Fivecoat, Kellie Fontecchio, Angie Hager, Richard Moose, Patrick Morgan, Maria Roberts, Margaret Roth, McKinsey Threlkeld, and Brad Waters.

The nominee for the one one-year youth term is Lexi Thomas-Harewood.

While the ballots are being counted, participants will enjoy fellowship and refreshments. Everyone is invited to bring a brunch finger food to share. Coffee and juice will be provided.
