Provide comfort and strength, and nurture sustained wholeness for the future. We pray for members and friends of this family of faith who find themselves less frequently in this place due to health or other circumstances. As they worship with us online, help them to feel the fullness of this community's love for them and the deep comfort of your presence. Shine the light of your love into the lives of Mary Frances, Chubby, Tad, Becky, Pat, Marilyn, Wayne, Gloria, Ann, Steve, Mary, Ellie, Diane, Herb, and those joining us online whose names we may not know. As we watch and we wait, **hear our prayer.**

Empathizing God, you are with us in our joys and our despair. Help those of us who celebrate this season loudly and boldly to remember that the holidays are, for many, a time of stress, depression, anxiety, and hopelessness. Draw near to anyone struggling with mental health challenges, financial burdens, grief, illness, familial conflict, or ostracization. As we watch and we wait, **hear our prayer.**

Reforming God, you are clearing a path for all who have been relegated to the margins and who suffer under the cruel fist of oppression. As the Supreme Court heard arguments this week surrounding transgender healthcare, we pray for all those this case will impact. Continue coming among us in ways that help the world to understand that transgender people are your people, bearing your image. Affirm and support parents who seek to support their children's gender identity. As we watch and we wait, **hear our prayer.**

God of Expectations, this community celebrates so much this holiday season, including the impending birth of three precious children of God. Give strength, comfort, and ease to Cassie Castle and her family, Lauren Smithman and her family, and Leah Sommerville and her family as they watch and wait for the birth of their babies this Advent and Christmas season. Grant each family and each forming life the gift of your sustaining presence. As we watch and we wait, **hear our prayer.**

Reassuring God, we remember those who have died and rest in you. Guide us in deep gratitude for their life, and allow us to learn from their faithful witness. As we watch and we wait, **hear our prayer.**
