
Let us confess our sin in the presence of God and of one another.



SECOND READING A reading from John.

¹In the beginning was the Word; the Word was in God's presence, and the Word was God. ² The Word was with God from the beginning. ³ Through the Word all things came into being, and apart from the Word nothing came into being that has come into being. ⁴ In the Word was life, and that life was the light of humanity— ⁵ and the Light shines in the darkness, but the darkness did not overcome it. ⁶ Then came one named John, sent from God with a testimony, ⁷ to testify about the Light, so that through this testimony everyone might believe. ⁸ John himself was not the Light; but came only to testify about the Light the true Light that enlightens all people. ⁹ The Word was coming into the world— ¹⁰ was in the world— but was not recognized by the world even though the world was made through the Word. ¹¹ The Word was rejected by those who were the Word's very own people. ¹² Yet any who did accept the Word, who believed in that Name, were empowered to become children of God— ¹³ children born not of blood, nor of flesh, nor human will— but born of God. ¹⁴ And the Word became flesh and dwelled among us; we saw the Word's glory— the glory of a parent's only child— full of grace, full of truth.

GOSPEL

The Holy Gospel according to Saint Matthew the second chapter.

Glory to you, O Lord.

¹ In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, magi from the East came to Jerusalem, ² asking, "Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed the star at its rising, and have come to pay homage." ³ When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him; ⁴ and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, Herod inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born. ⁵ They told him, "In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet:

⁶ 'And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah,

are by no means least among the rulers of Judah;

for from you shall come a ruler

who is to shepherd my people Israel."

⁷ Then Herod secretly called for the magi and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. ⁸ Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage." ⁹ When they had heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was. ¹⁰ When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. ¹¹ On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. ¹² And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.

GREAT THANKSGIVING


The Lord is with you. **And also with you.**
