God is calling us, in our words and deeds, to be brave, to work for justice, to stand in the gap, to build bridges. What is your role? How will you be brave? How will you live out the baptismal calling to work for justice?

I take comfort in the fact that we are in this together. We are bound together in the community of Christ. The Holy Spirit is alive and well and full of boundless energy to empower and embolden us for the work ahead. Be of good courage. Take heart. Believe that together we have power to change the world for good.

## COUNCIL NOTES

At the January meeting of the Congregation Council, the council...

---received the annual report from the Foundation Committee noting that \$128,989 in grants have been awarded (the list is included in this publication);

---participated in a council orientation where expectations, process, and governance were outlined and discussed;

---engaged in an orientation to Trinity's finances and received the Treasurer's Report noting that end-of-year offerings and expenses for 2024 included a \$46,160 deficit which is reflected in a decrease in the Net Working Fund;

---received a report from the Executive Committee noting that a finalized contract on the 429 Property is close and will ultimately include a meeting of the congregation for approval, the boiler for the Gym has been ordered with the hope of installing in late January, the anticipated date for completion of the organ is early May, and the remediation of the damage incurred in September from the hurricane in the basement of the Sanctuary is beginning; and

---blessed and approved a slate of nominees (a large list of potential nominees was created by the members of council) to serve on the Coordination Team for Trinity's upcoming Strategic Planning Process.

## TRINITY LUTHERAN FOUNDATION GRANTS

The Trinity Lutheran Church Foundation Committee met in December to consider grant applications for 2024. Ten grants totaling \$128,989 were awarded to the following recipients:

- Fostering Great Ideas  
\$10,515 to support mentors for youth in foster care
- LiveWell Greenville  
\$2,500 to help fund the Formula Bank which provides baby formula to low-income families
- Rebuild Upstate  
\$10,000 to complete four home repair projects for low-income homeowners in the Greenville area
- Nicholtown Child and Family Collaborative  
\$10,000 to support parents participating in the Nurturing Skills for Young Parents and Parent Café Program
- 864Pride  
\$12,000 to provide funding to the LEAP program designed to connect transgender persons with a trained peer support specialist
- Trinity Lutheran Church  
\$7,500 to provide scholarship assistance to Patrick Preacher for his fourth year of seminary
- Trinity Lutheran Church  
\$6,000 to host a Festival of Queer Books Event in February of 2025
- Trinity Lutheran Church  
\$12,839 to fund Trinity's Strategic Plan in 2025
- Trinity Lutheran Church  
\$50,000 to fund the remediation and replacement efforts in the basement of the Sanctuary from hurricane damage
- Trinity Lutheran Church  
\$7,635 to the Major Replacement and Repairs Designated Account

The Trinity Lutheran Church Foundation has given away in excess of \$2,000,000 since 1997.
