Genesis 15:1-12, 17-18

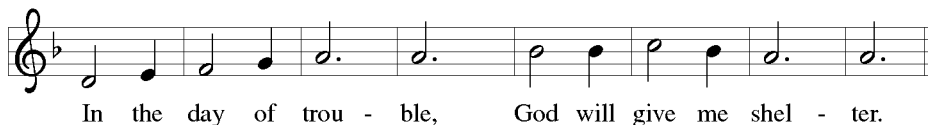
A reading from Genesis.

<sup>1</sup>After these things the word of GOD came to Abram in a vision, "Do not be afraid, Abram, I am your shield; your reward shall be very great." <sup>2</sup>But Abram said, "O most high GOD, what will you give me, for I continue childless, and the heir of my house is Eliezer of Damascus?" <sup>3</sup>And Abram said, "You have given me no offspring, and so a slave born in my house is to be my heir." <sup>4</sup>But the word of GOD came to him, "This man shall not be your heir; no one but your very own issue shall be your heir." <sup>5</sup>God brought Abram outside and said, "Look toward heaven and count the stars, if you are able to count them." Then God said to him, "So shall your descendants be." <sup>6</sup>And Abram believed GOD; and GOD reckoned it to him as righteousness. <sup>7</sup>Then God said to Abram, "I am GOD, who brought you from Ur of the Chaldeans, to give you this land to possess." <sup>8</sup>But Abram said, "O GOD most high, how am I to know that I shall possess it?" <sup>9</sup>God said to him, "Bring me a heifer three years old, a female goat three years old, a ram three years old, a turtledove, and a young pigeon." <sup>10</sup>Abram brought him all these and cut them in two, laying each half over against the other; but he did not cut the birds in two. <sup>11</sup>And when birds of prey came down on the carcasses, Abram drove them away. <sup>12</sup>As the sun was going down, a deep sleep fell upon Abram, and a deep and terrifying darkness descended upon him. <sup>17</sup>When the sun had gone down and it was dark, a smoking fire pot and a flaming torch passed between these pieces. <sup>18</sup>On that day GOD made a covenant with Abram, saying, "To your descendants I give this land, from the river of Egypt to the great river, the river Euphrates."

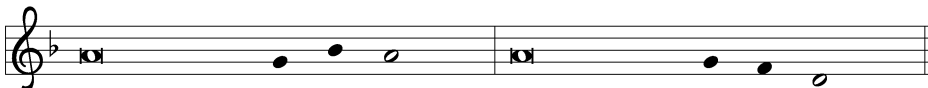

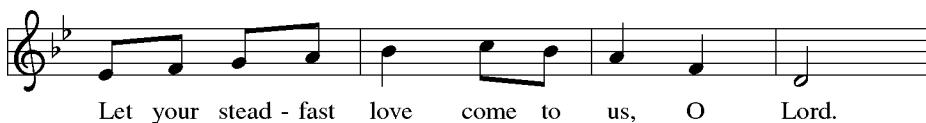
