Dear Members and Friends of the Trinity Family,

The Lenten Season has traditionally been a somber, quiet, reflective season...a time to refrain from things that bring pleasure, a time for self-denial. But not this year, not this Lent, not for me. The continued acts of cruelty from the powers that be that demean, isolate, wound, and cause deep pain for the oppressed and marginalized are already more than enough to bear this Lent. I can't possibly add another heavy burden or difficult task to my to-do list. This Lent needs to be practiced differently, creatively. Instead of denial, this Lent calls for joy - as much joy as we can possibly muster.

Joy is an act of resistance. Every time we allow ourselves to experience joy, we are resisting the feelings of despair and hopelessness that surround us. The antidote to these feelings just might be joy. I am willing to give joy a try! Could we do that together as a community? Could we focus on joy? Practice joy?

For me, joy is a walk in the sunshine, coffee with a friend, time spent with family and chosen family, a good book, a hot bath. Joy is sending or receiving a midday text of encouragement, lighting a candle, listening to 80's music, going to bed early, purchasing a bouquet of flowers, baking homemade muffins, hand-addressing cards to mail, exploring a new hobby, or creating something beautiful. What brings you joy? Can you use this Lenten season to focus on, to find joy?

May these forty days of Lent draw us closer to Christ, strengthen the bonds we share in community, and bring us joy...boundless joy.
