Children's Worship Activity. Accompanied by Child Protection trained adults, children are invited to leave worship after the children's sermon to go hear the scripture read in ways more appropriate for their age. Using lectionary stories heard in worship each Sunday, the children not only hear scripture, but enjoy a related activity such as a game, craft, or music. Children return to worship during the sharing of the peace and in time to participate in the celebration of Holy Communion.

Procession with Palms next Sunday, April 13. All children are invited to meet in the Narthex, ten minutes prior to worship, to participate in the Procession with Palms. At the end of the procession, children will sit with their parents.

Palm Sunday Congregation Lunch. Please join the Trinity family and friends for lunch and table fellowship featuring a baked potato and salad bar, hosted by the Parish Life Committee, following worship next Sunday, April 13. A children's table will be set up featuring a chicken tender meal. Let's gather to build and strengthen community at the beginning of Holy Week as the journey to the cross intensifies.

Communion. In an effort to further embrace Trinity's mission of welcome, affirmation, and hospitality, both wine and grape juice are available. The addition of grape juice enables God's beloveds for whom alcohol is problematic to participate fully. Raise a finger at the altar if you desire grape juice.

Worship Bags are available in the Narthex or the Gym for children. Bags for preschoolers are tied with a white ribbon. Bags for elementary age children have no ribbon. After worship, used bags may be placed in the baskets next to the stands.

Nursery for infants and toddlers. A nursery hosted by a member of the Trinity staff, Beth Oswald, as well as a small group of rotating volunteers who have been trained in Trinity's Child Protection Policy is available each Sunday morning beginning at 9:45 am to care for infants and toddlers who would prefer enjoying play time instead of attending 10:00 am worship. The nursery is located on the first floor of the Pence Building. Please reach out to a greeter or usher if you need assistance.

Adult Faith Formation is discussing Trinity's Lenten devotional, *Crossing Thresholds* by Mark Tidsworth for the remaining Sundays in the Lenten season (March 16-April 13). Participants are encouraged to engage with the devotional and journal prompts throughout each week in order to discuss and share various insights and reflections during Adult Faith Formation. A leader helps facilitate open conversation while a recorder takes note of the insights gleaned from discussion that might prove helpful for the Coordination Team for Trinity's strategic planning process. Children's Faith Formation Relaunch. Children's Faith Formation meets Sunday mornings from 9:00 - 9:50 am with three classes divided by age ranging from infant to grade 5.
