Can we learn to adapt, accommodate, modify, and adjust as we deal with the constancy of change?

When life is moving quickly, when we are weary from all the change in our lives, the prophet Isaiah reminds us that God is with us in the transitions, in the beginnings, and in the endings. God will never leave us or forsake us. God is always making a way for us, always clearing a path for us. When change comes, and it surely will, remember that God is always with you. God will give you everything you need to make it to the other side of change.

## ORGAN UPDATE FROM PASTOR PARHAM

As we began 2025, we eagerly anticipated that the second organ case (aka “South Tower”) would be built and playable by the spring of 2025. Unfortunately, the winter weather emergencies that hit the southern states in early 2025 dealt a serious blow to the timetable of our organ project. Our builder, D. C. Schroth Organ Builders, facing numerous emergency calls from his clients throughout that region, had to redirect time and staff resources of his small shop to repairing damage caused by precipitation, wind, and the extreme cold in organs throughout the Kentucky/Tennessee/Ohio region. We at Trinity even had one of those emergencies, and were fortunate that our local technician was able to respond immediately to that. The impact on our project was that, instead of being *installed* during the Sundays after Easter, the project only *began* construction in the Louisville shop after Easter.

The good news is that much progress has been made over the summer. The South Tower case, which houses the Pedal and Great divisions of the organ, is being constructed in the Louisville shop as I type this. The case frame has been erected. The pipework has all been finished. The windchests are in the last phases of fabrication and will soon be populated with hundreds of beautiful pipes. In spite of the unpredictability of the supply chain, all electrical components are in hand and either already installed, or are about to be. Unfortunately, we still have no firm installation date, but we will be sharing that as soon as we have one.

This one-session class taught by Patrick Preacher will invite participants to explore the practice of praying the Psalms through the lens of Walter Brueggemann's *Spirituality of the Psalms*. Using his framework of orientation, disorientation, and new orientation, participants will discover how the Psalms give voice to the full range of human experience—from stability and gratitude to grief, anger, and renewal.
