Dear Members and Friends of the Trinity family,

Have you ever had the experience of happily living your life when, out of nowhere, a major obstacle shows up and blocks your way. It's the loss of a career, a mental health crisis, a scary diagnosis, a challenge to your sober lifestyle, a long-held secret that has become too much to keep, a child in distress, an unexpected pregnancy, the death of a loved one, or the need to leave a toxic relationship. In these moments, the tendency is to turn inward, to believe that the burden is yours to carry alone. It's easy to become overwhelmed, to collapse under the burden and weight of it all - believing that it is yours to bear in isolation.

The words from Hebrews remind us of an important truth. We are surrounded by a great cloud of witnesses, a great cloud of witnesses on whose shoulders we stand. Our ancestors in the faith endured great hardship. They relied on one another. They cared for one another. And they survived...and thrived! We also have a great cloud of witnesses surrounding us - an entire community, that will stand with us, who will help us carry the heavy burdens of this life. Sometimes, all it takes, is courage and vulnerability to say the words, to name the burden, to utter the truth of your individual pain, and in the verbalizing to another human being, the load is lightened, lifted.

You are not alone. God and God's beloveds walk with you. All of us carry heavy burdens that weigh us down and distract us, but with the help of community, the help of God, we can release those burdens. We can be honest about our suffering and pain. We can trust the community. We can be whole, well, and free.

## COUNCIL NOTES

At the August meeting of the Congregation Council, the council...  
---learned that expenses through July are \$8,604 less than expected;  
---learned that a critical step in the process to finalize the sale of the 429 Property includes permission from the city to demolish the building facing North Main Street and that the city will make this decision in mid to late October;  
---received an update on the strategic planning process noting that the information gleaned from the Listening Sessions along with a prayerful process of discernment is helping the Coordination Team create a list of initiatives to guide Trinity into the next three to five years of ministry as Trinity continues to proclaim and live out the inclusive gospel of Christ's love for absolutely all people;  
---approved a request for use of the facility from the Mast family to host Jenna's senior clarinet recital at Trinity this fall; and  
---approved the conveyance of the church bus (purchased in 2001 and no longer safe or reliable) through sale or donation.
